


## BEVEL-JAW FOR VISES.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 252,407, dated January 17, 1882.

Application filed April 26, 1881. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HORATIO D. WEST, of Stafford Springs, in the county of Tolland and State of Connecticut, have invented a certain new and useful Improvement in Bevel-Jaws for Vises, of which the following is a description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, wherein—

The improvement is one in that class of vises which have a detachable adjustable extra jaw; and the improvement consists in such a detachable jaw pivoted on a base-block, which is in turn supported on the screw case of the permanent jaws, giving the adjustable and detachable jaw a firm support, which enables it to be hammered upon.

The letter a denotes one jaw (including the leg) of the vise as a whole, and b denotes the 20 other jaw, suitably pivoted to the jaw a.

The letter c denotes the screw, d the lever

for operating the screw, and e the interiorly-threaded screw-case.

The letter f denotes the extra bevel-jaw, rotarily hung on pivot-pin g, which stands up 25 from the base-block h, which finds firm support on the screw-case e. The base-block h, with its appurtenant bevel-jaw, is attached to the jaw a by springs i i, which embrace the neck thereof. A set-screw or other equivalent clamp- 30 ing device may be used in place of the springs; but the latter are preferable.

I claim as my invention—

The extra bevel-jaw f, rotarily hung on the base-block h, provided with springs i and 35 bedded upon the screw-case e, all substantially as described.
