MANUFACTURE OF OIL.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEO. W. BANKER, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State | duced from petroleum or paraffine in nearly of New York, have invented new and valuable 5 Improvements in a Composite Oil for Lubricating, &c., of which the following is a specification.

Since the introduction of petroleum and its products for lubricants, leather-dressing, and 10 other purposes, attempts have been made to combine such oils with castor-oil; but no satisfactory nor inexpensive mode of permanently combining castor oil with mineral oils has heretofore been discovered and made known to the 15 public.

My discovery consists in the use of corn-oil for combining castor-oil with heavy oil proequal proportions.

What I claim is—

The herein-described composite oil, composed of castor-oil, corn-oil, and heavy oil produced from petroleum or paraffine oil, in nearly equal proportions.
