

SHIRT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 256,887, dated April 25, 1882.

Application filed October 7, 1881. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, F.A. DIETRICH, of Freeport, Illinois, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Shirts, of which the following 5 is a clear, full, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which fully illustrates my invention.

To enable others to make and use my invention, I will describe the exact manner in which

10 I have carried it out.

The object of my invention is to secure the suspenders in proper position on the shoulders of the wearer and to prevent them from slipping from the shoulders; and it consists in 15 the combination of devices hereinafter ex-

plained and claimed.

In the drawing, A represents a shirt in position on the person, and to each shoulder of the shirt is secured the strap B, provided with 20 a button-hole, into which fits the button b, attached to the removable loop C, through which works the suspender, as shown in the draw-

ing. It is evident that instead of a button and button-hole, as described, any other convenient mode of securing the loop to the strap B 25

may be used.

The object in separating the loop from the strap is to allow the loop to remain on the suspenders when the latter are removed from the shoulders. They could be made in one piece 30 without departing from the spirit of my invention.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Let-

ters Patent, is—

The shirt A, in combination with an attached strap, B, and removable loop C, located on the top of the shoulder, all constructed and arranged to operate substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
