HAIR-TONIC.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 259,884, dated June 20, 1882.

Application filed March 22, 1882. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM E. MAROLD, of Terre Haute, in the county of Vigo and State of Indiana, have invented a new and
5 useful Improvement in Hair-Restoratives, of which the following is a specification.

The object of this invention is to prevent the hair of the head from falling out, and to produce a new growth of hair in case of baldness.

10 The compound consists of the following ingredients, combined in the proportions stated, viz: water, one gallon; hop-root, two and a half pounds; grape-vine buds, three ounces; rosemary, two ounces.

15 The above ingredients are to be mingled and boiled for two hours, then filtered and bottled for use.

In using the restorative it should be applied to the head three times a day to produce a new growth of hair, and once or twice a day
20 to prevent the loss of hair.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A hair-restorative consisting of a filtered
25 decoction in water of hop-root, grape-vine buds, and rosemary, in the proportions specified.
