HAIR-RESTORATIVE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 260,570, dated July 4, 1882.

Application filed April 10, 1882. (Specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Charles Hughes, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Hair-Restorative Composition, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

My composition consists of the following ingredients, combined in the proportions stated, viz: neat's-foot oil, two gills; crude petroleum, one and one-half table-spoonful; alcohol, (proofspirit,) one gill. These ingredients are to be thoroughly mixed by agitation at about blood heat.

In using the above-named composition for restoring or invigorating the hair, a small quan-

tity is to be poured into the palm of the hand and applied to the hair or scalp, with vigorous rubbing of the scalp, either with the hands or with a hair-brush.

Having thus described my invention, I claim 20 as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The herein-described hair restoring and invigorating compound, consisting of neat's-foot oil, petroleum, and alcohol, in about the proportions specified.
