

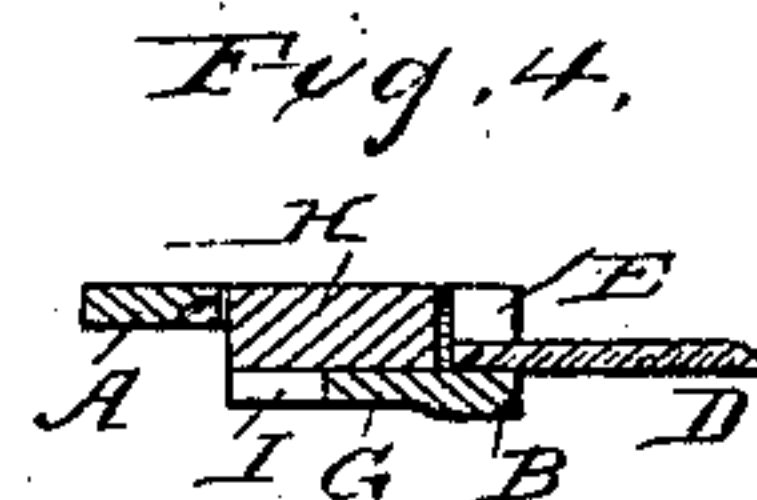
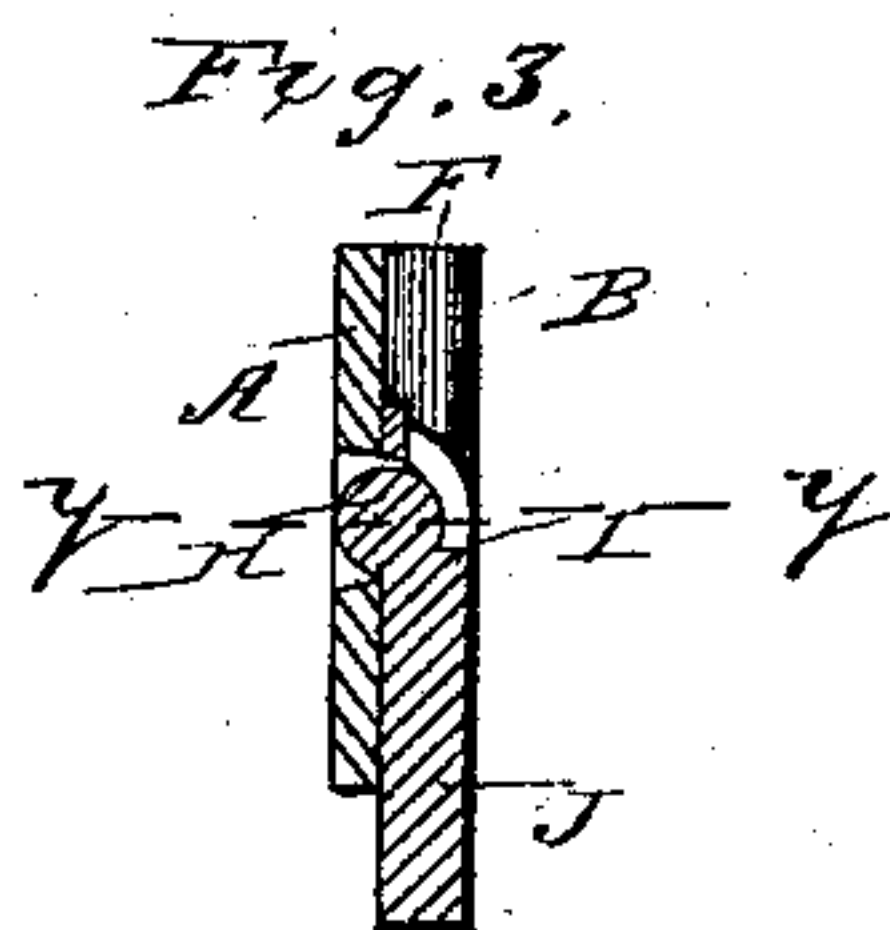
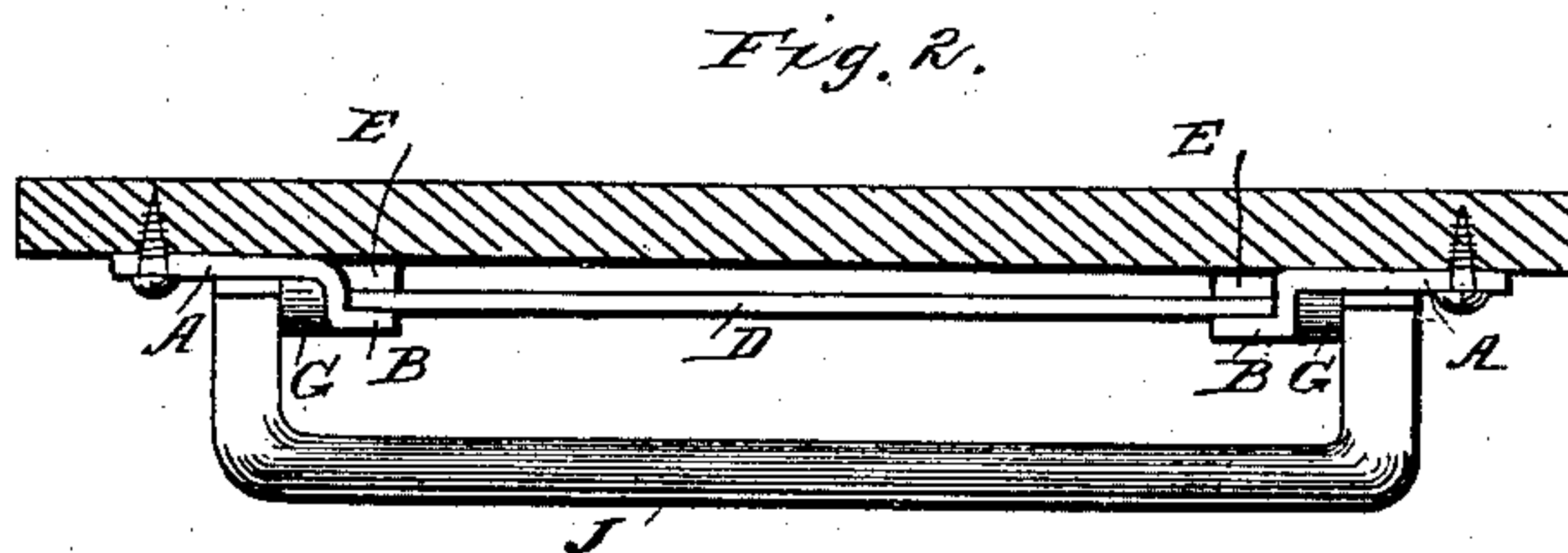
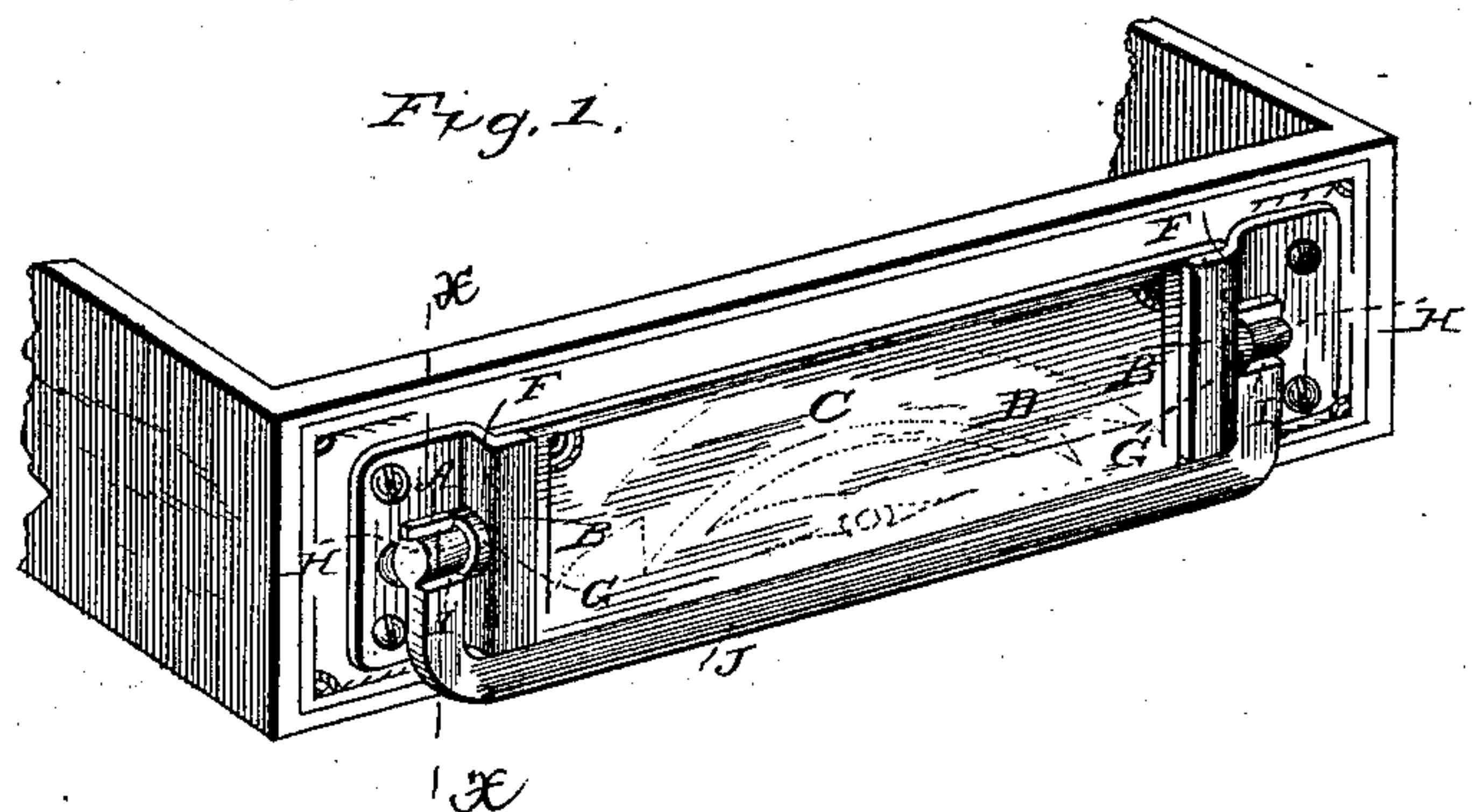

DRAWER-PULL.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 264,166, dated September 12, 1882.

Application filed June 5, 1882. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES F. JOHNSON, of Dayton, in the county of Montgomery and State of Ohio, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Drawer-Pulls; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form a part of this specification.

Figure 1 is a perspective view. Fig. 2 is a top plan view. Fig. 3 is a vertical sectional view on the line $x x$, Fig. 1; and Fig. 4 is a sectional view on the line $y y$, Fig. 3.

Corresponding parts in the several figures are denoted by like letters of reference.

This invention relates to drawer-pulls; and it consists in so constructing the same as to form a case or frame to receive a label indicating the contents of the drawer, as will be hereinafter more fully described, and particularly pointed out in the claim.

In the drawings hereto annexed, A A represent plates or frames having flanges B B, between which a label, C, and glass or cover D may be slid into said frame until resting upon the bottom ledge, E. The sides F F of frames A have boxes or bearings G G for the spindles or journals H H of the handle J, which is provided with shoulders I, forming stops, when the handle is raised to a horizontal position.

When the handle hangs down, as seen in Fig. 1, the label is fully exposed, thus indicating the contents of the drawer, to which my improved pull may be secured by screws passing through suitable openings which have been provided in the frames or plates A. The label may in a moment's time be removed and another one substituted whenever desired.

This invention is exceedingly cheap, simple, and convenient for use in drug and other stores and for many other purposes which will readily suggest themselves.

By using handles J of different lengths the frame-plates A A may be secured any desired distance apart, so as to receive labels of any desired length.

Having thus described my invention, I claim and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States—

The herein-described drawer-pull and label-holder, consisting of the plates A A, having flanges B, bottom ledges, E, and boxes or bearings G, in combination with the handle J, journaled in said boxes or bearings, substantially as set forth.
