

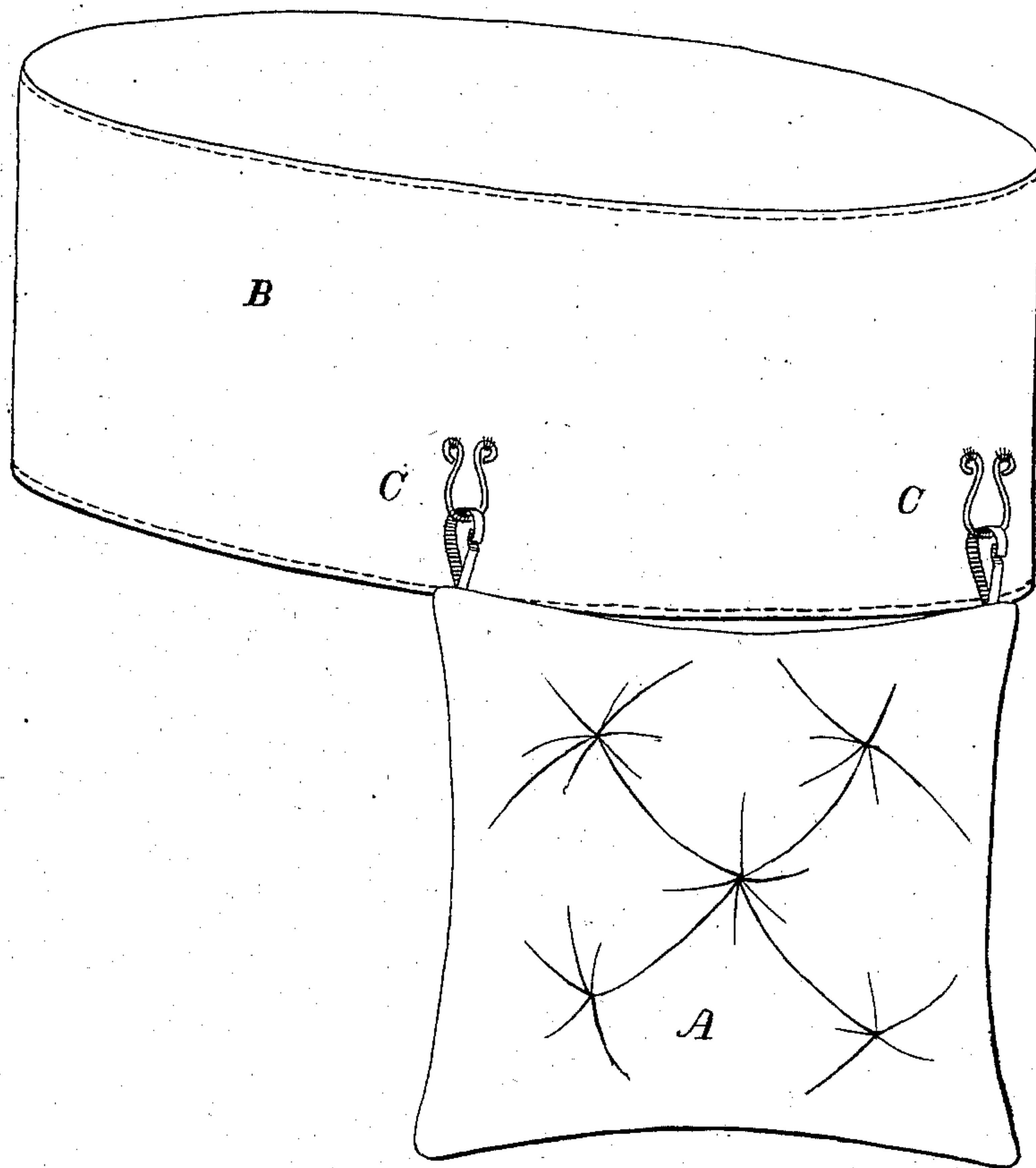

PAD OR PILLOW FOR THE USE OF TRAVELERS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 270,242, dated January 9, 1883.

Application filed August 19, 1882. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE E. MITCHELL, of the city of Brooklyn, county of Kings, and State of New York, have invented a Head-
5 Rest, Pad, or Pillow for the Use of Travelers, the same to be attached to or connected with a hat, cap, or other head-gear worn by travelers, or by a string, strap, elastic, or other attachment, connecting the same with or sus-
10 pending it from the head, which pad or pillow, when so connected or attached, may be used or worn as a pillow or head-rest against the back of a car-seat, chair, or elsewhere for the comfort or convenience of travelers for sleep-
15 ing or otherwise; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this speci-
20 fication.

The nature of my invention, its purpose, use, and object is hereinbefore fully described.

To enable others to make and use my invention, I will proceed to describe its construction.

25 The pad or pillow referred to is about four inches square, and may be made of cloth or any other convenient, durable, and appropri-

ate material, which pad or pillow is to be filled with any material which will make it soft, for the purpose of resting the head upon or against. 30

In the drawing hereto attached, said pad or pillow is marked A. The cap to which it is attached is marked B, and the loop and snap connecting the same to the cap is marked C. A hook and eye, button and button-hole, a cord, 35 strap, elastic, or their equivalents may be used instead of the loop and snap, as shown in the drawing, for a temporary attachment or detachment of the pad or pillow to and from the hat, cap, or other head-gear, or to suspend the 40 same from the head.

The pad or pillow may be firmly and permanently attached to or connected with the hat, cap, or other head-gear.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to 45 secure by Letters Patent, is—

A pad or pillow in combination with a cap or other suspending apparatus, for the uses and purposes set forth.
