REMEDY FOR DIPHTHERIA.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 271,506, dated January 30, 1883.

Application filed October 30, 1882. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John G. L. Myers, of Osceola Mills, in the county of Clearfield and State of Pennsylvania, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Medical Compounds; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

This compound or mixture, which is for the treatment of diphtheria and throat complaints of a similar nature, is prepared by thoroughly mixing the following ingredients in the proportions set forth, viz: chlorate of potash, two drams; tincture guaiaci, two drams; spirits of niter, four drams; sirup of balsam of tolu, one ounce.

By the peculiar action of the undissolved chlorate of potash the false membrane found in the throat in all cases of diphtheria is speedily absorbed or dislodged, and by the healing agency of the guaiac and tolu the throat is healed, while with the aid of the therapeutical agency of the niter a perfect cure is effected.

I have found this mixture to be a stimulant, antiseptic, and solvent, neutralizing the diphtherial germ. I have also found it greatly beneficial in cases of ordinary sore throat and in all affections of the respiratory organs. The 30 dose for an adult is half a tea-spoonful every hour, followed by abstinence from all drinks for twenty minutes.

I claim and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States—

A medical compound for the treatment of diphtheria, composed of chlorate of potash, tincture of guaiac, spirits of niter, and sirup of balsam of tolu, mixed in the proportions set forth.
