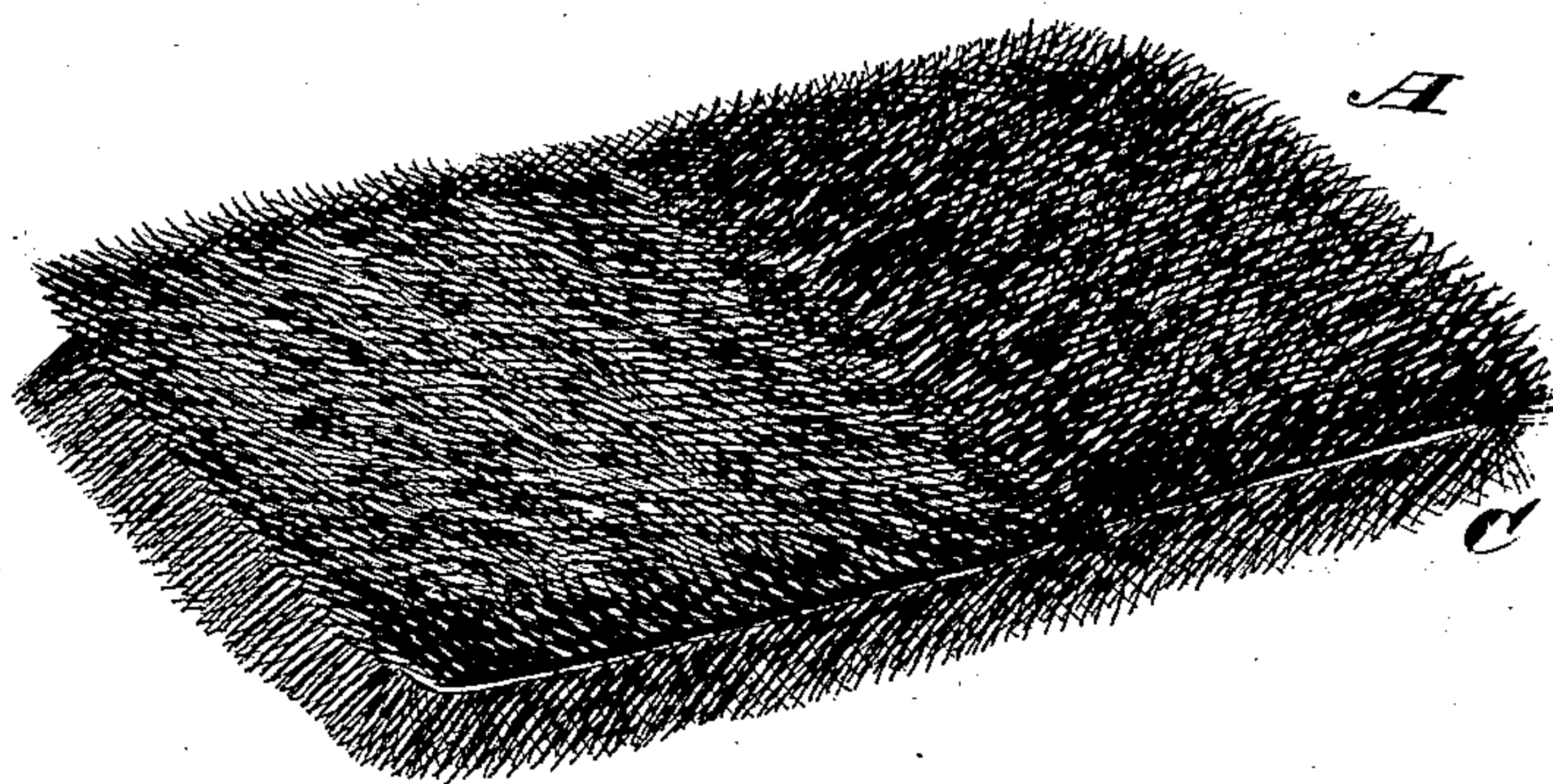

BRUSH.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 273,524, dated March 6, 1883.

Application filed July 21, 1882. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LUCINIUS HAVASY, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Brush for Silk,
5 Velvet, Fur, and like Materials, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

The object of my invention is to provide a new and improved brush for brushing silk, velvet, fur, and similar material without injuring
10 the same.

The invention consists in a brush provided on one side with short-haired stiff or bristle-like fur and on the opposite side with soft and
15 fine fur, the bristle-like fur being used to brush the dust from the silk or velvet and the soft fur being used to smooth and finish the brushed silk or velvet.

Reference is to be had to the accompanying
20 drawing, forming part of this specification, in which my improved brush is shown in perspective.

A piece, A, of fine soft fur is attached to the back of a piece of clipped fur, C, which has

short and stiff bristles, so that this fur C can
25 be used as a brush to remove the dust, and the fur A can then, in this case, also be used to smooth and finish the silk, &c. If desired, the stiff fur C may be attached to one side of a
30 flat board or plate and the soft fur A to the opposite side, whereby a pocket-brush will be formed, which can be used for brushing different kinds of fabric, and which can be carried
35 very conveniently, as it occupies but very little space.

Having thus fully described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

As an improved article of manufacture, a brush having bristle-like fur on one side and
40 fine soft fur on the other, the two being secured back to back, with or without a plate between them, substantially as herein shown and described.
