





TICKET-HOLDER FOR CAR-SEATS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 274,621, dated March 27, 1883.

Application filed May 12, 1882. (Model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CROWELL S. MACANN, a citizen of the United States, residing at Rahway, in the county of Union and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Railroad-Ticket Holders, of which the following is a specification.

The nature of my invention consists in an attachment to the back of the seat of a railro road passenger-car for holding the ticket of a passenger within sight of the conductor, and also in front of and in sight of the passenger.

In the accompanying drawings, which form a part of this specifiation, Figure 1 is a vertical section of the reversible back of a railway-car seat of sufficient width for two passengers, with my improvement attached thereto, which improvement is shown in section at A A, &c., Fig. 1. The attachment is shown in vertical longitudinal section in Fig. 2, in which the springs B B B, that press onto and hold the ticket, are shown.

Fig. 3 is a vertical cross-section of the ticketholder, showing the ticket Cinserted, being held

by the springs BB B against the beveled-edged bed D. E is the housing or cover which protects the springs BB B from injury, which cover, together with the bed D, is fastened to the back of the seat, in the manner shown in Fig. 1, by means of screws FF, &c. As a substitute for the springs BB, rubber may be used, of such thickness as to allow the ticket to pass between the under side of the rubber and the upper side of the beveled-edged plate D.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to

secure by Letters Patent, is-

The above-described device, (as an improvement in ticket-holders adapted to be permanently attached to the back of a car-seat,) consisting of the beveled-edged plate D, provided with springs B B B, as shown, in combination with a cover or housing, E, all arranged as shown and described.
