

## HAT-TIP.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 274,873, dated March 27, 1883.

Application filed February 13, 1883. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, WILLIAM J. WING-HART and WILLIAM H. ROCHFORD, citizens of the United States, residing at New York, in the county and State of New York, have invented new and useful Improvements in Hat-Tips, of which the following is a specification.

This invention consists in a hat-tip made of a piece of plain satin or other equivalent material cut to the required shape, and having printed thereon a stripe of different color from its body in imitation of an inserted stripe. The stripe is ornamented with imitation stitches, and, if desired, also with various designs or characters.

This invention is illustrated in the accompanying drawing, which represents a plan or face view of the hat-tip when completed.

In this drawing, the letter A designates a 20 piece of satin or other material, such as may be employed for the manufacture of hat-tips. This piece is plain, either white or of any other desired color, and after it has been cut out to the required shape for a hat-tip a stripe, B, is 25 printed on it in a color different from the color of the body of the hat-tip. By these means a hat-tip is obtained which presents the same appearance as a hat-tip provided with an inserted stripe, and the imitation is rendered 30 still closer by printing upon the stripe B two rows of imitation stitches, a a. The color of these imitation stitches may be the same as | that of the body of the hat-tip, or it may be any other color; but it is desirable to select a 35 color different from that of the stripe B.

If the work is properly executed, a hat-tip is obtained which has such a close resemblance to a hat-tip with an inserted stripe that it can be distinguished only by close observation, and

in the manufacture of this new hat-tip much 40 time and labor, and also a large percentage of material, are saved as compared with a hat tip having an inserted stripe.

On the stripe B are also printed ornaments b, or certain words or characters may be printed thereon, so as to impart to the finished article an ornamental appearance.

Of course our hat-tip may be used in caps or other head-coverings.

What we claim as new, and desire to secure 50 by Letters Patent, is—

1. A hat-tip made of a piece of plain satin or other material suitable for the purpose, said piece being cut out to the required shape, and having printed thereon a stripe of different 55 color from its body in imitation of an inserted stripe, substantially as shown and described.

2. A hat-tip made of a piece of plain material cut out to the required shape, and having printed thereon a stripe of different color from 60 its body, said stripe having printed on its face two rows of imitation stitches, substantially as shown and described.

3. A hat-tip made of a piece of plain material cut out to the required shape, and having 65 printed thereon a stripe of different color from its body, said stripe having printed on its face two rows of imitation stitches, and various ornaments or characters, substantially as shown and described.
