CLEANING COMPOUND.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 275,189, dated April 3, 1883.

Application filed February 24, 1883. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MARY J. GIBLER, a citizen of the United States, resident at Beloit, in the county of Rock and State of Wisconsin, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Cleansing Compounds; and I do declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

This invention has relation to preparations for cleansing fabrics from grease and soil; and it consists in the novel combination of the following ingredients, compounded together as hereinafter set forth.

In order to make this cleansing compound, I take one-half gallon of gasoline, one ounce of chloroform, one ounce of ether, one-quarter ounce of borax, one-quarter ounce of oil of

sassafras, one-quarter ounce of oil of cloves, and three ounces of alcohol, and mix these ingredients intimately by stirring or shaking, the oils being first cut by the alcohol, and the other ingredients then added.

Having described this invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A cleansing mixture for fabrics, compounded of gasoline, chloroform, ether, borax, oil of sassafras, oil of cloves, and alcohol, in the proportions specified.
