## WATERPROOFING COMPOUND.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 275,738, dated April 10, 1883. Application filed March 8, 1883. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Conrad L. Weimann, j a citizen of the United States, residing at New York, in the county and State of New York, 5 and John Weimann, a citizen of Germany, residing at Brooklyn, in the county of Kings | and State of New York, have invented new and useful Improvements in Waterproofing Compounds, of which the following is a speciro fication.

This invention is a compound for waterproofing cloth, paper, or other fabric, consisting of resin, paraffine, gum-copal, benzole, and benzine. These ingredients are combined in 15 about the following proportions: resin, one part; paraffine, four parts; gum-copal, one part; benzole, seven parts; benzine, eight parts; but these proportions may be varied, although the best result is thereby produced.

In preparing our compound the resin, paraffine, and gum-copal are first dissolved in the benzole. The benzine is then added and the solution is filtered, when it is ready for use.

The compound thus obtained may be ap-25 plied to cloth, paper, or other fabric by im-

mersing the fabric therein or coating the fabric therewith, as by a brush, and a characteristic feature of the compound is that the fabricis left porous, and at the same time is adapted to shed water.

When the compound is applied to fabrics which are light in color, pale resin is used to render the compound substantially colorless. The benzole used is what is generally known as "pure benzole."

What we claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is—

The within-described waterproofing compound, consisting of resin, paraffine, gum-copal, benzole, and benzine, combined in about 40 the proportions set forth.
