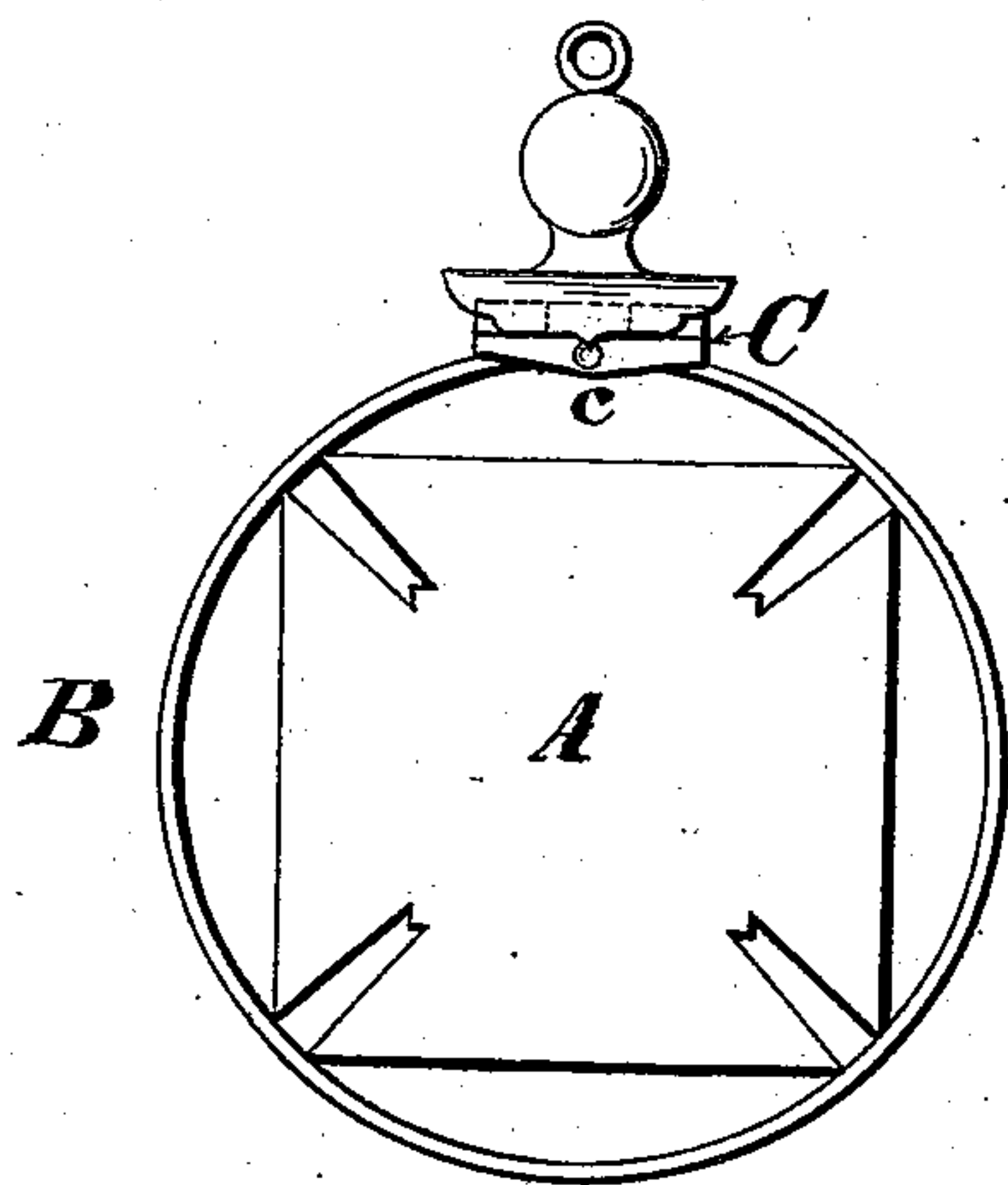

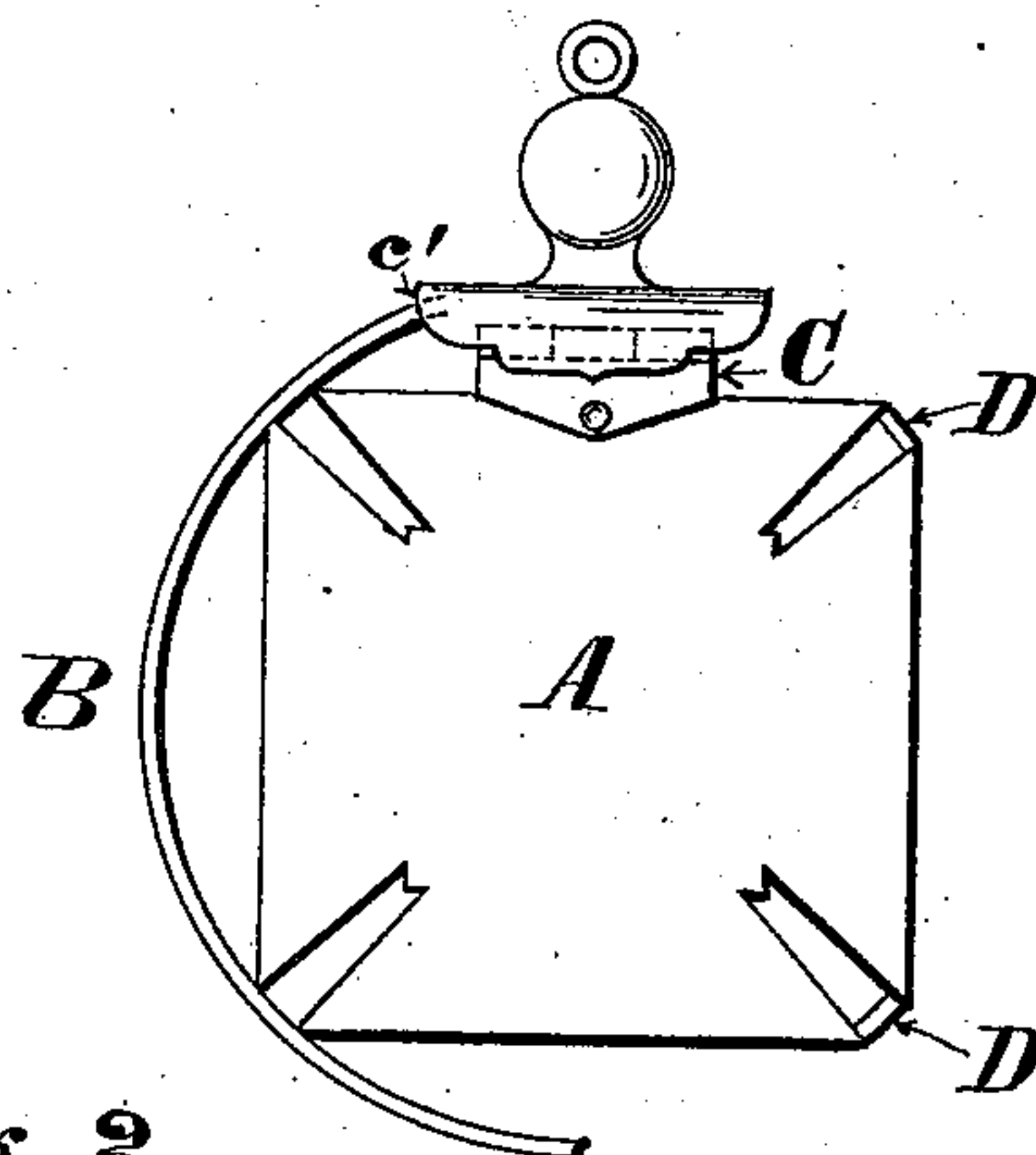
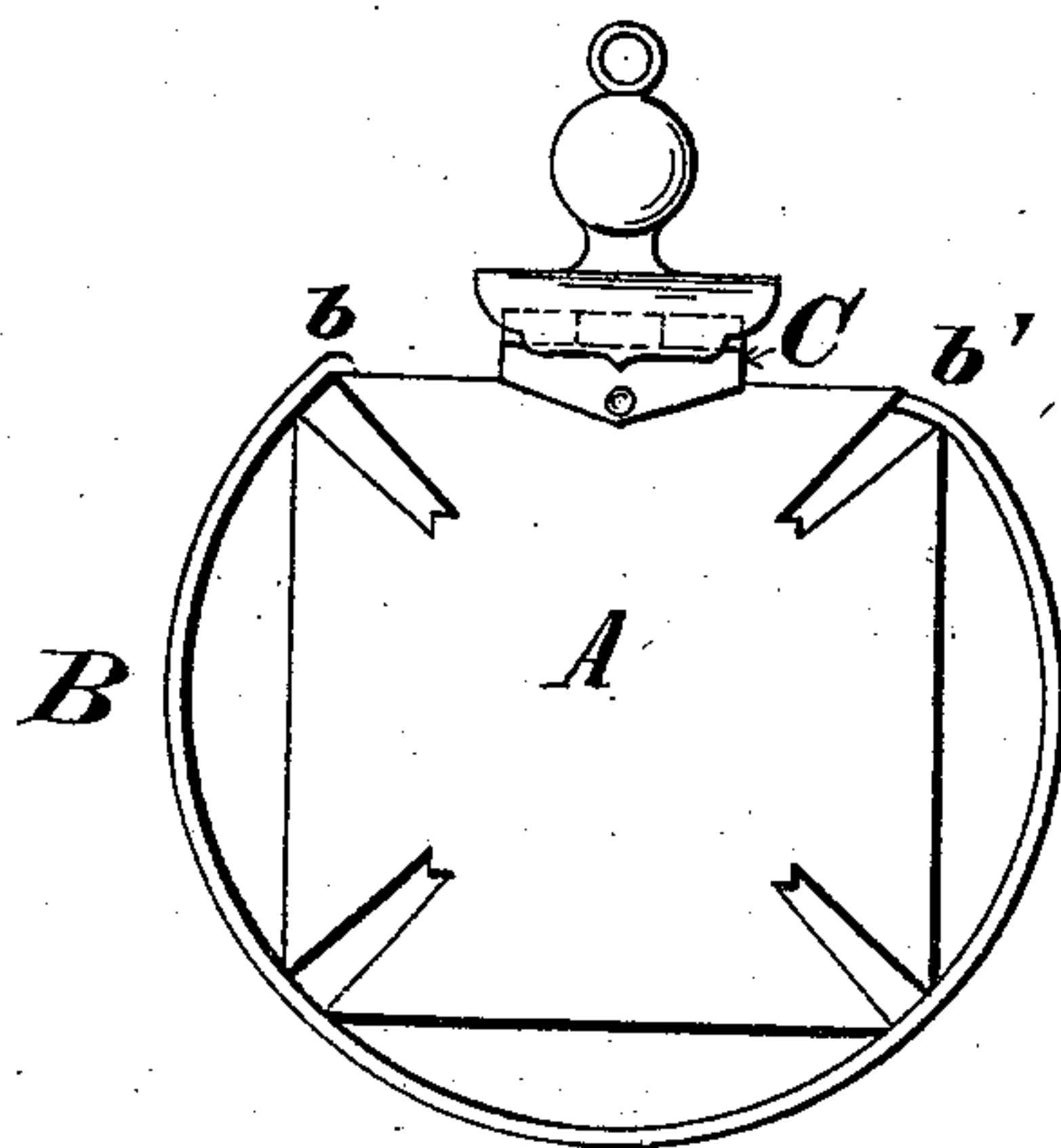

SAMUEL EARL MOSHER, OF CHILLICOTHE, OHIO.

KNIGHTS-TEMPLAR CROSS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 289,851, dated December 11, 1882.

Application filed May 17, 1883. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL EARL MOSHER, of the city of Chillicothe, county of Ross, and State of Ohio, have invented new and useful
5 Improvements on the Knights-Templar Cross, (a Masonic emblem;) and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, and to the letters and
10 figures marked thereon, which form part of the specification.

This invention has relation to a "ring" or protection surrounding the cross, by which its beauty is very much enhanced and the sharp
15 corners are covered and protected against catching on clothing, &c., which often results in the tearing of clothes, breaking of chains, and the loss of valuable property.

Figure 1: A represents the cross or charm, and B the ring, which is attached to and extends around it; C, the attachment, hook, or chain, which is attached to the ring for the purpose of carrying or suspending the cross.

Fig. 2: B shows a sectional view of the ring
25 as being open, with the end *c* extending under

the cape or collar, which gives it the appearance of a whole ring and prevents the ends from catching. Letters D D represent the corners as being protected by a bridge or material extending between the points.

Fig. 3 shows a sectional view of the ring B as extending a sufficient distance to protect the corners, and the manner by which the ends may be held.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. In a Knights-Templar cross the ring B, attached to and extending wholly or partially around the cross.

2. In a Knights-Templar cross, the attachment C, hook or chain fastened to ring B at letter *c*.

3. In a Knights-Templar cross, the bridge extending between the points D D, substantially as described.
