




FINGER-RING.

EPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 293,985, dated February 19, 1884.

Application filed January 17, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Christoph Staiger, of Brooklyn, county of Kings, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Finger-Rings, of which the following is a specification.

This invention has reference to an improved finger-ring of that class in which stones of considerable size are set into an enlarged frame of the ring; and the invention consists of a finger-ring having an enlarged frame or setting, with solid end walls and side cramps, by which the beveled sides of the stone are re-

tained.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 represents a front elevation, Fig. 2 a side elevation, and Fig. 3 a top view, of my improved finger-ring.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

20 sponding parts.

A in the drawings represents a finger-ring, the enlarged front part of which forms a setting, B, for an onyx, cameo, or other ornamental stone, C. The stone C is made either of straight or convex form, the latter form being used for the so-called "glove-rings." The sides of the stone C are slightly beveled, while the ends

are straight, the stone being retained in the setting B by solid end walls, b b, and side cramps, b' b', which latter are arranged at a suitable distance from each other. The cramps b' b' serve to retain the stone firmly and securely in position without any chance of its getting detached from the setting. The openings between the side cramps, b' b', expose the sides of the stone through the interstices between the cramps in addition to the face, whereby a more ornamental and finished appearance is imparted to the ring.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

As an improvement in finger-rings, the combination of the enlarged frame or setting having solid end walls and side cramps with a stone having straight ends and slightly-beveled sides, substantially as set forth.
