

BADGE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 299,000, dated May 20, 1884.

Application filed April 2, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK NEUBERT, of | Springfield, in the county of Hampden and State of Massachusetts, have invented certain 5 new and useful Improvements in Badges, of

which the following is a specification.

This invention has reference to an improved badge for campaign clubs, secret societies, and similar purposes; and it consists of an orna-10 mental suspension-piece provided with a pin or other means for fastening it to the coat or vest, a transverse bar connected to the suspension-piece by links, and a banner-shaped main piece, which is suspended from the bar | as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent— 15 by rings.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 represents a front elevation of my improved badge, and Fig. 2 is a vertical transverse sec-

tion of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

A in the drawings represents the suspensionpiece, which is provided at the back with a pin or other fastening device, B, for attaching the 25 badge to the coat or other point of support. The suspension-piece A may be made either in the form of an American eagle, as shown in Fig. 1, or in any other desired shape, according to the purpose for which the badge is 30 to be used. From the suspension-piece A is suspended, by links a a, a transverse bar, C, having ornamental end tips, b b. From the bar C is again suspended, by rings dd, the main $\{$

piece D, which is preferably made in the form of a banner and ornamented in any suitable 35 design.

The suspension-piece A and main piece D may be made of any suitable material, preferably of sheet metal; but the main piece D may also be made of silk having a proper backing. 40

The badge is designed for the use of campaign clubs, secret societies, rifle clubs, &c., the general design of the same being so arranged as to correspond to the special application of the badge.

Having thus described my invention, I claim

1. A badge consisting of a suspension-piece provided with a fastening device at the back, an intermediate transverse bar suspended from 50 the suspension-piece, and a main piece suspended from the bar, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.

2. A badge composed of a suspension-piece provided with a pin or other fastening device 55 at the back, an intermediate transverse bar suspended by links from the suspension-piece, and a main piece suspended by rings from the transverse bar, substantially as set forth.
