

MERIDETH P. CURLEE, OF PERDUE HILL, ALABAMA.

## PLOW.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 302,472, dated July 22, 1884.

Application filed July 11, 1883. Renewed June 18, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MERIDETH P. CURLEE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Perdue Hill, in the county of Monroe and 5 State of Alabama, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Plows, of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying drawings.

This invention relates to certain improvements in plows; and it has for its objects to provide an improved mold-board and cutter for the same, as more fully hereinafter specified. These objects I attain by the means illustrated in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 represents a side elevation of my improved plow, and Fig. 2 a view partly in section and partly in elevation of the same.

20 The letter A indicates the plow-beams, and B the handles, to one of which is secured a pointed shoe of iron, (indicated by the letter C.) The iron has welded to it a plowshare, D, which at its rear is provided with a tongue, 25 E, which interlocks in a recess at the lower

end of the wooden mold-board F.
The letter G indicates a glass mold-board,

which sets over the wooden mold-board, the two mold-boards being secured to their seats by means of the bolts H.

The letters H' and I indicate braces, which are applied to the parts of the plow to impart rigidity to the same.

The letter K indicates a cutter, which is hinged in a recess in a section, L, secured to 35 the plow-beam, and is braced to said beam by means of a rod, M, as indicated.

The operation of my invention will be apparent from the above without further description.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination, in a plow, of the curved wooden mold-board, having a facing of glass of similar configuration, and the metallic plow- 45 share, the whole being secured together by suitable connections, substantially as specified.
