

JEWEL-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 312,766, dated February 24, 1885.

Application filed March 29, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM SCHOTT, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Lock-Hinges for Jewelry-Boxes, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to an improved lock-hinge for jewelry or other boxes, by which the lid is firmly held either in open or closed position, and a separate fastening device dis-

pensed with. The invention consists of a lock-hinge one half of which is applied to the bottom of the box and provided with an inwardly-projecting 15 triangular-shaped knuckle or heel, and of a second leaf, which is applied to the lid and provided with ears which are connected to the triangular knuckle by means of a pintle. Through a narrow opening in the upper part 20 of the leaf attached to the lid a spring is inscreed and turned down against the leaf, while the larger opening in the lower part of said leaf permits the spring to be vibrated by the pressure of the triangular knuckle whenever 25 the lid is raised or lowered. The pressure of the spring against one beveled side of the knuckle keeps the lid from rising automatically, but when the box is open the pressure of the spring against the other beveled side pre-30 vents the lid from falling from open position.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 represents a perspective view of a jewelry-box with my improved lock-hinge. Figs. 2 and 3 are vertical transverse sections of the same, showing the hinge respectively in closed and open position; and Figs. 4 and 5 are details of the lock-hinge drawn on a larger scale.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A in the drawings represents the bottom, and B the lid, of a jewelry or other box.

To the bottom A and lid B are riveted or otherwise secured the leaves C and D of my improved lock-hinge. The leaf C is provided with a fixed upwardly-projecting knuckle or

heel, C', to which is hinged the leaf D, that is applied to the inside of the lid by means of bent ears dd, as shown in Figs. 4 and 5. A band-spring, E, is extended through a recess of the leaf D, and secured to the same by bend- 50 ing its rear end, E', forward over the leaf D. The front end of the spring E serves to engage the fixed heel C' of the leaf C. The rear part of the spring E abuts preferably against the top of the lid or against a shoulder of the 55 rear wall of the lid, in case the hinge D and leaf C are of less length than said rear wall. When the lid B is thrown into open position, the band-spring E binds on the top of the fixed heel C', and retains thereby the lid in 60 open position, as shown in Fig. 3. When the lid is thrown into closed position, the spring E binds on the front of the heel C', and retains thereby the lid firmly in closed position on the bottom A, as shown in Fig. 2.

When the jewelry or other case is properly finished, the hinge is covered by the inside lining and outside covering, and thereby out of sight. It has the advantage that it retains the lid in open position, so as to exhibit prop-70 erly the articles of jewelry in the show-case, and to keep the case closed without requiring any additional lock or fastening.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—75

A jewelry-box provided with a hinge the body-leaf of which is provided with a triangular knuckle, the lid-leaf being provided with a band-spring which rests against different sides of the triangular knuckle in the dif-80 ferent positions of the lid, whereby the latter is automatically held open or closed, substantially as described.
