

BACK-BAND LOOP.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 314,829, dated March 31, 1885.

Application filed May 23, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph P. Hamilton, a citizen of the United States, residing at Franklin, in the county of Williamson and State of Tennessee, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Back-Band Loops; and I do declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to letters or figures of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

Figure 1 of the drawings is a front view of my device, and Fig. 2 is a vertical sectional

view of the same.

This invention has relation to back-band loops for the draft-chains of harness; and it consists in the construction and novel arrangement of devices, as hereinafter set forth, and particularly pointed out in the claim appended.

In the accompanying drawings, the letter
25 A designates the chain-loop, which has a
smooth solid back, b, and a front, c, slotted
above at d and below at e, for the passage of
the key F. At the top of the chain-loop is
formed the transverse band-loop portion G,
30 consisting of the end-connected bars h, k, and
l, of which the center bar, k, is provided with
downwardly-turned teeth m, adapted to engage the material of the band passing in front
thereof. The upper bar, h, is provided with
35 a central offset lug portion or swell, g, through

which is made a perforation, p, to receive a rivet, v, whereby the end of the leather or chain connection L is attached to the back of the lug. This leather strap or chain or connection L is brought forward over the lug or 40 swell g, and is attached to the key or tongue F, by means of a hook, z, formed on the end of the latter, or by a rivet, the end of the hook or head of the rivet being hammered to secure the leather in its connection to the key, or a 45 chain may be used connected to a hole, k', made in the top of the key. The length of the strap or chain L is sufficient to allow the key to hang in the slots or bearings d and e of the chain-loop A, and at the same time 50 to give sufficient play for the ready withdrawal of the key or tongue upward out of said bearing when it is desired to disconnect the chain.

Having described this invention, what I 55 claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A back-band fastener having its upper end formed into a buckle for adjustment on the back-band and having its lower end formed 60 into separate loops with a fastening-pin which is connected to the body by means of a flexible strap or band and adapted to engage with the chain.
