




COMBINED COLLAR-BUTTON AND NECKTIE-FASTENER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 316,044, dated April 21, 1885.

Application filed August 21, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE T. KELTING, of Washington, District of Columbia, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Combined Collar-Button and Necktie-Holder; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use the same.

My invention relates to a combined collar-button and necktie-holder, the object being to provide a convenient device of this character which will obviate the employment of elastic loops on neckties and the usual neckband on scarfs when the latter are worn with "turn-down" collars.

The invention consists in the features of construction and combination of parts hereinafter fully described, and pointed out in the claim.

In the drawings, Figure 1 illustrates my improvement applied to a scarf. Fig. 2 is a view in perspective of the combined button and necktie-holder detached, and Fig. 3 is a vertical section of the same.

A represents a collar-button provided with a projecting shank, *a*. B is a horizontal bar secured to the outer end of the shank *a*, and provided with depending end hooks, C C, adapted to engage a necktie. This bar B should be of a length sufficient to properly balance and support the necktie in place.

In using the device the button A is inserted through the front button-holes of the collar-band and neckband of the shirt, thus securing the collar and leaving the hooks C C depending to receive the necktie.

Having fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A combined collar-button and necktie-holder, consisting of the combination, with a button formed with a shank, *a*, of a bar, B, provided with depending end hooks, substantially as set forth.
