



BELT-TIGHTENER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 318,707, dated May 26, 1885.

Application filed April 13, 1885. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Brandt, in the county of Susquehanna, in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented new and 5 useful Improvements in Sewing-Machines, of which the following, taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, is a full, clear, and exact description.

The purpose of this invention is to facilitate to the operation of slackening and tightening the driving-belts of machines, and especially those of sewing machines; and the invention consists in the novel construction and combination of parts, as hereinafter more fully de-15 scribed, and specifically set forth in the claims.

In the annexed drawings, Figure 1 is an elevation of the pedestal or standard of a sewingmachine with my improvement attached thereto. Fig. 2 is a longitudinal transverse section 2c on line x x, Fig. 1, and Fig. 3 is a side view of that part of the standard to which my invention is applied.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

25 Srepresents a standard of a sewing-machine. Said standard is formed with the vertical guide-slot a, in which slides a block, b. On

this block is pivoted the belt-pulley P, which, Be it known that I, MICHAEL DUGAN, of by a belt, c, transmits motion to the sewing mechanism. A lever, l, is fulcrumed on the 30 standard S and connected with the slide b, so as to permit of raising and lowering the slide by said lever, and thus slacken and tighten the belt c as may be desired. By means of stops n n on the side of the standard S the le- 35ver l is sustained in its raised and lowered position.

> Having described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is---

> The combination, with the standard S, of the guide a, slide b, lever l, pulley P, pivoted on the slide, and the stops n on the standard, substantially in the manner described and shown.
