## STOVE-POLISH.

BPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 329,529, dated November 3, 1885.

Application filed September 14, 1885. Serial No. 177,092. (Specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Albert N. Bender, a citizen of the United States, residing at Manhattan, in the county of Riley and State of Kansas, have invented a new and useful Composition of Matter to be Used for Polishing Stoves and Preventing Iron from Rusting, of which the following is a specification.

My composition consists of the following inro gredients, combined in the proportions stated,
viz: two parts of dammar-varnish to two parts
of turpentine and one part of drier and one
part of black-lead; thin with gasoline to desired consistence. These ingredients are to
be thoroughly mingled by agitation. Apply
with a brush in the ordinary manner of using
paint or common stove-blacking.

I do not confine myself to the exact proportions of the ingredients named, because they

may perhaps be varied according to the con- 20 dition of the material to which the composition is to be applied.

I am aware that paints and stove-polishes have been made in which black-lead and mineral oils were used, and this I do not claim; 25 but

What I do claim as a new composition of matter, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A compound of dammar-varnish, turpen- 30 tine, drier, black-lead, and gasoline, substantially as and for the purposes set forth.
