

HAT-SWEAT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 343,924, dated June 15, 1886.

Application filed March 19, 1886. Serial No. 195,774. (No model.. Patented in France June 6, 1885, No. 169,408, 1n Belgium August 17, 1885, No. 69,668.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Jacques Schorestène, a citizen of France, and a resident of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Sweat Leathers or Bands for Hats and Caps, (for which I have obtained Letters Patent of France, dated June 6, 1885, and numbered 169,408, and Belgium, dated August 17, 1885, and numbered 69,668,) which improvement is fully set forth in the following specification.

This invention consists in making sweat leather or bands with a pocket for tickets, checks, &c. I make a slit near the upper edge of the sweat leather or band in such a manner that when the hat or cap is on the head the pocket extends downward. Behind this slit, and on the inside of the sweat leather or band, I attach a piece of cloth or other suitable material by stitching or by other suitable means, so that it forms a receptacle and support for the ticket, check, &c., when the end is passed through the slit.

Figure 1, in the accompanying drawings, A 25 A A A represents a sweat leather or band for a hat or cap.

The line b c represents the slit in the sweat leather or band through which the end of the ticket, check, &c., is passed.

The dotted lines represent the edges of the 30 cloth or other material where attached to the inside of the sweat leather or band.

Fig. 2 represents a sectional view of the pocket with the slit slightly pulled out for the admission of the ticket, check, &c.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim is—

A sweat-leather for hats or caps provided with a pocket for holding tickets, checks, &c., formed by a longitudinal slit in the leather at 40 or near the upper margin of the same, and a suitable backing, substantially as hereinbefore set forth.
