INSECTICIDE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 350,690, dated October 12, 1886.

Application filed June 23, 1886. Serial No. 205,999. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, REBECCA MCKEE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Composition of Matter Constituting an Insect-Destroyer, of which the following is a specification.

My composition consists of the following ingredients, combined in the proportions stated: naphtha or benzine, one gallon; pulverized alum, one ounce; pulverized borax, one ounce; gum-camphor, one ounce; oil pennyroyal, one ounce; oil sassafras, one ounce; alkaneted oil, one-half ounce. These ingredients are to be thoroughly mixed by agitation.

In use the composition is applied to places that are infected with insects or vermin of any

kind, and it will be found that the composition will act as a thorough efficient destroyer of such insects.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The herein-described composition of matter to be used as an insect-destroyer, consisting of naphtha or benzine, pulverized alum, borax, gum-camphor, oil of pennyroyal, oil of sassafras, and alkaneted oil, substantially in the proportions specified.
