



RULER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 352,787, dated November 16, 1886.

Application filed May 24, 1886. Serial No. 203,152. (Model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM P. SISSON, a citizen of the United States, residing at Garnett, in the county of Anderson and State of Kansas, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Ruler Attachments, of which the following is a description.

The object of my invention is to provide a ruler for ruling lines, with such attachment for connection with the hand as shall facilitate the use of the ruler and render the work of book-keeping very much more convenient and expeditious, and avoid the slipping of the ruler and the making of false lines or blots.

The drawing is a perspective view of the ruler provided with its attachment, and showing its relation to the hands when in use.

The ruler A has attached to it a tubular socket or folded clamp, B, into the opening in which the little finger of the left hand is inserted, in which position the ruler is firmly

connected to the hand. When in use, this connection serves to firmly hold the ruler from slipping from the side pressure of the pen, and when not in use the left hand, with the ruler attached, is removed from the page with the ruler still attached to it, in which relation the ruler is quickly applied to and removed from the paper, as may be required, thus saving much time for the book-keeper, and rendering his work more convenient and less liable to be marred by irregular lines or blots.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

As a new article of manufacture, a ruler having attached thereto a finger socket or clamp, substantially as and for the purpose described.
