COUGH REMEDY.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 370,191, dated September 20, 1887.

Application filed December 23, 1886. Serial No. 222,369. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CAROLINE HAYCOCK, a citizen of the United States, residing at Baltimore, in the State of Maryland, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Remedies for Coughs and Colds; and I do declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

My invention relates to a remedy for the treatment of coughs, colds, and pulmonary diseases; and it consists of the following ingredients: To one gallon of pure water is added one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of a pound of hops, one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) ounce of hoarhound, one (1) ounce of peppermint-herb, one (1) ounce of licorice-root, one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) pound of rock-candy, one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) pound of sugar, and the juice of five (5) lemons, the whole being boiled sufficiently to thoroughly compound. The mixture is administered in doses of one tablespoonful every three hours to adults, and one-half tea-spoonful every three hours to children. These doses are for severe cases, and may be lessened when the cough or cold is less severe.

This compound in its effects is sedative, the hoarhound, peppermint, licorice, rock-candy, sugar, and lemon acting directly upon the inflamed parts of the throat, and the narcotic properties of the hops producing the necessary soothing effect without the usual constipation which attends the use of some narcotics.

The compound, when prepared for market, is placed in bottles and tightly sealed, which keeps it in proper condition and prevents any deterioration or loss of its properties.

Having described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by United States Letters Patent, is—

A remedy for coughs, colds, or pulmonary diseases, consisting of hops, hoarhound, peppermint, licorice, rock-candy, sugar, and lemon-juice, in about the proportions set forth.
