


## JUG-HANDLE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 371,018, dated October 4, 1887.

Application filed May 5, 1887. Serial No. 237,217. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Charles H. Wool-DRIDGE and James M. Hendron, of Shipman, in the county of Macoupin and State of Illinois, have invented a new and Improved Jug-Handle, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the annexed drawings, forming a part thereof, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a jug proro vided with our improved handle, and Fig. 2 is an inverted plan view.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts in both views.

The object of our invention is to attach to pottery jugs a wire bail or handle which will permit of readily carrying the jug in a vertical position.

The invention consists in the peculiar construction and arrangement of parts, as here inafter fully described, and pointed out in the claim.

The jug A is of the usual form, except that the ordinary jug-handle is omitted. The frame B, which surrounds the jug, consists of a rectangular bottom piece, a, formed of wire, and upright pieces b, connected with the corners of the bottom piece, a, and the ring c, surround-

ing the neck of the jug and connected with the looped ends of the uprights b. In two of the uprights b, between the ends thereof and 30 on diametrically-opposite sides of the jug, are formed eyes d, in which are received the hooked ends of the wire bail e. The middle portion of the bail e is made straight, and receives a wooden handle, f, of the usual description.

Having thus fully described our invention, we claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

As an improved article of manufacture, a jug-handle comprising a wire frame consisting 40 of the rectangular bottom piece, a, the ring c, and the upright pieces b, having their ends connected to the said bottom piece and ring, two of the said uprights, on diametrically-opposite sides and between the ends thereof, being 45 provided with eyes d, and the bail e, secured to the said eyes, as set forth.
