HAIR-TONIC.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 376,803, dated January 24, 1888.

Application filed October 21, 1887. Serial No. 233,037. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, A. FELIX PRATT, a citizen of the United States, residing at Montpelier, in the county of Washington and State of Vermont, have invented a new and useful composition of matter to be used for cleansing and removing dandruff from the scalp and restoring the hair to its original color and luster, of which the following is a specification.

10 My composition consists of the following ingredients, combined in the proportions herein stated, viz: To make one gallon of my composition, take four hen's eggs, one pound of glycerine, four ounces of lac sulphur, and sixteen
15 ounces of alcohol, to which add enough pure water to make one gallon. These ingredients are to be thoroughly mingled and mixed and put into bottles for use.

20 In using the above-named composition, apply it to the head and scalp three times a week in

quantities sufficient to dampen the hair for combing.

By the use of this composition the dandruff is speedily and thoroughly removed from the scalp, the scalp itself becomes clean and health- 25 ful, it invigorates the growth of the hair and restores it to its natural color and softness, and prevents the hair from falling out. Always shake the bottle before using it.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is— 30

The herein-described composition of matter to be used as a hair-restorative, consisting of water, eggs, glycerine, sulphur, and alcohol, in the proportions specified.
