

FEED-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 412,304, dated October 8, 1889.

Application filed January 14, 1889. Serial No. 296,351. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WALDO V. SNYDER, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Canton, in the county of Stark and State of 5 Ohio, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Feed-Boxes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the annexed drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is an isometrical view showing box properly attached to a vehicle-wheel. Fig. 2 is a rear view of the box. Fig. 3 is a longitudinal sectional view showing the box open. Fig. 4 is an end view showing box 15 closed. Fig. 5 is an enlarged detached view of one of the supporting-hooks. Fig. 6 is a view of one of the hinges.

The present invention has relation to feedboxes, and its nature consists in the differ-20 ent parts and combination of parts hereinafter described, and particularly pointed out | I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letin the claims.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts in all the figures of the draw-

25 ings. In the accompanying drawings, A represents the sides and ends of the box proper, which are preferably formed of canvas. The bottom B is formed of sheet metal, and may 30 be substantially of the form shown in the drawings. To the top of the box proper are attached the bars C and C', said bars being securely attached to the arms D and D' in any convenient and well-known manner. To the 35 bar Care pivotally attached the links a, which are for the purpose of engaging the extensions b, as shown in Fig. 4, thereby holding the box in a closed position. To the arms D are securely attached the supporting-hooks 40 E, said hooks being located substantially as shown in Fig. 4, and are for the purpose of attaching the feed-box proper to the top of a vehicle-wheel, as illustrated in Fig. 1. These supporting-hooks are provided with the 45 notches d, which are for the purpose of engaging the tires of vehicle-wheels having different widths.

For the purpose of preventing the box

from becoming accidentally displaced while in use the strap F is provided, which is at-50 tached to the hub of the vehicle-wheel. Said strap is attached to the bottom B by means of staples or their equivalent. The arms D and D' are hinged together at their bottom or lower end, substantially as illustrated in Fig. 6. 55

It will be seen that by my peculiar arrangement feed can be placed in the box and the box closed, as illustrated in Fig. 4. It will also be understood that the canvas is to be securely attached to the bottom B and the 60 bars C and C'. The bottom B is hinged to the bar D by folding or wrapping the back edge or side of said bottom around the bar, substantially as illustrated in Fig. 3.

It will be understood that the box proper 65 may be attached to a wagon-box or any other desired place to feed a horse.

Having fully described my invention, what ters Patent, is—

1. The combination of the canvas adapted to form the sides and ends of a feed-box, the bottom B, the bars C and C', located at the top of the box and provided with the extensions b, the links a, and the bars D and D', hinged 75 together at their bottom or lower ends, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.

2. The herein-described feed-box, consisting of the canvas ends and sides, the hinged arms D and D', the bars C and C', located at the top 80 of the box, and the supporting-hooks E, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.

3. The combination of the bars C and C', having the extensions b, the links a, the arms D and D', hinged together at their bottom 85 ends, and the strap F, attached to the bottom B, and adapted to engage the hub of a vehicle, substantially as and for the purpose specified.
