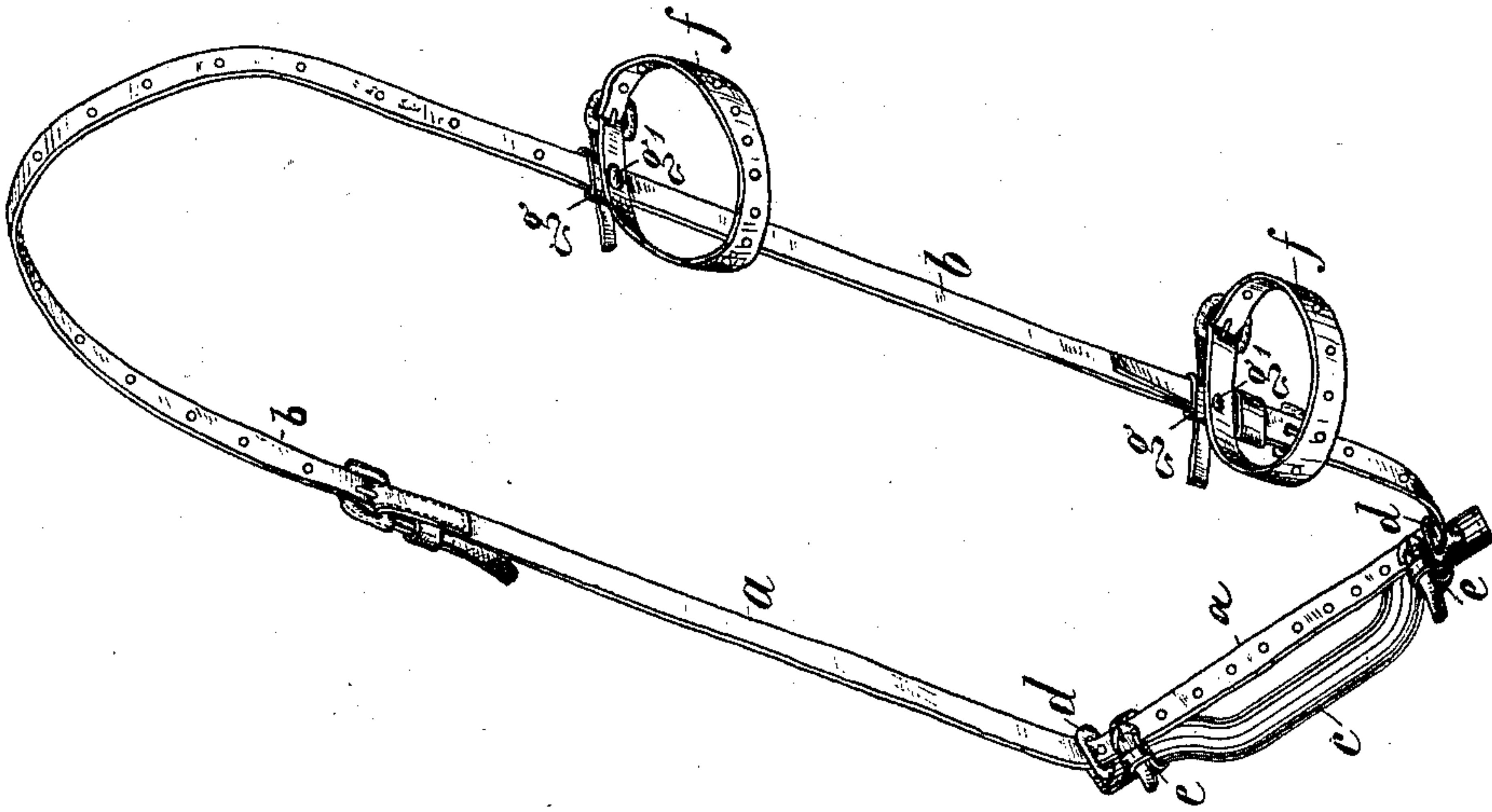

## SHAWL-STRAP.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 435,101, dated August 26, 1890.

Application filed June 7, 1889. Serial No. 313,502. (No model.)

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HUGO VON MANN-TIECHLER, a resident of Munich, Bavaria, Germany, have invented a new and useful  
5 Improvement in Shawl-Straps, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to an improved shawl-strap; and it consists in the various features of improvement, more fully pointed out in  
10 the claim.

The accompanying drawing represents a perspective view of my improved shawl-strap.

The letters *a b* represent two straps buckled together.

15 *c* is a rigid bar or handle provided with a pair of swiveled eyes *d*, through which the strap *a* passes. Around the strap *b* pass the sliding loops *g*, to which are swiveled by pins *g'* the looped straps *f*.

20 In use the bar *c* hangs down, and the overcoats, &c., are passed between the bars *c* and

strap *a*. Thus the bundle is properly flattened and will not molest the wearer. To hold small articles—such as ladies' neckerchiefs, &c., in place—I employ straps *e*, that hold strap  
25 *a* down upon bar *c*, the straps *e* being provided with buckles that engage perforations in strap *a*. The looped straps *f* serve for the reception of canes and umbrellas.

I claim as my invention—

30 The combination of bars *c*, having swiveled eyes *d* at each end thereof, and buckled straps *e*, with strap *a*, adapted to pass through the swiveled eyes and to be engaged by the buckled straps, substantially as specified.
