

## BUTTON.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 435,820, dated September 2, 1890.

Application filed June 20, 1890. Serial No. 356,036. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NICOLAS GEOFFROY, a citizen of the United States, residing at New York, in the county and State of New York, 5 have invented new and useful Improvements in Sleeve-Links, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to improvements in sleeve-links; and the invention consists in the details of construction set forth in the following specification and claim, and illustrated in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is an inverted plan view of a sleevelink containing my invention. Fig. 2 is a section along x x, Fig. 1. Fig. 3 is a section along y y, Fig. 2.

In the drawings, the letters A A indicate two buttons which are joined by a connection or link B. The link is joined to the buttons by hinged eyes or connections C. The eyes C swing on pintles D having legs E soldered or fixed to plates F. These plates are soldered or secured to the under side of the buttons A.

In the drawings both eyes C are shown as

being hinged; but, if desired, one eye may be hinged and the other rigidly secured to its button. I prefer, however, to have both eyes C hinged, as thereby each button A is flexibly 30 arranged so as to be readily slipped or passed through a button-hole.

As the buttons are not detachable from the link B, said buttons are not liable to be lost, and by hinging the buttons as described they 35 can be readily slipped through a button-hole without mussing the sleeve or cuff.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination, with the buttons A, each 40 having a rigidly-attached pintle D, provided with legs E, of the swinging eyes C, journaled on the pintles, and the link B, loosely connected to the swinging eyes, substantially as and for the purpose described.
