LINIMENT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 435,984, dated September 9, 1890.

Application filed May 29, 1890. Serial No. 353,625. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM CARROLL SUMMERS, a citizen of the United States, residing at Forrest City, in the county of St. Francis and State of Arkansas, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Medical Compounds; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

The said medical compound is used as a liniment; and it consists of the following ingredients, combined in the proportion and in the manner stated, viz: To make the liniment, take one-half pint of whisky, one ounce of camphor-gum, two ounces of saltpeter, two ounces spirits turpentine, one-half pint of apple vinegar, one ounce spirits of ammonia, one-half pint coal-oil, and two ounces sweet milk. Mix thoroughly and bottle for use. No heat is used in its preparation.

This liniment is to be used externally by

rubbing, and will be found to be highly beneficial in cases of neuralgia, sore eyes, sore throat, lame back, sprains, bruises, cuts, wounds, old sores, colic, all weaknesses of the limbs, swelling in any part of the body, headache in the morning, and sweeney, scratches, charbon in horses, &c.

What I desire to secure by Letters Patent is—

The herein-described medical compound as a liniment, consisting of whisky, camphor-gum, saltpeter, spirits turpentine, apple vinegar, spirits of ammonia, coal-oil, and sweet milk in the proportions specified.
