




CARL WÜSTEMANN, OF OBERHAUSEN, GERMANY.

HAT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 437,807, dated October 7, 1890.

Application filed December 16, 1889. Serial No. 333,997. (No model.) Patented in Germany April 17, 1889, No. 49,294; in France July 5, 1889, No. 199,408, and in England October 31, 1889, No. 17,235.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CARL WÜSTEMANN, a citizen of the German Empire, and a resident of Oberhausen, in Germany, have invented 5 new and useful Improvements in Hats, (for which I have obtained a patent in Germany, No. 49,294, dated April 17, 1889; in France, No. 199,408, dated July 5, 1889, and provisional protection in Great Britain, No. 17,235, to dated October 31, 1889,) of which the following is a specification.

My invention relates to improvements in hats, and has for its object to provide means whereby the lining of the hat can be utilized as a traveling-cap. I attain this object by the means illustrated in the accompanying

drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a vertical section of the hat and traveling-cap; and Fig. 2, a plan of the under side thereof, partly in section.

Similar letters refer to similar parts throughout the several views.

The hat-brim a, preferably the front por-

tion b thereof, so as to increase its stiffness and thereby prevent it breaking, through saluting, I form double, and on the inner edge with a slit c', which forms a pocket and serves for the reception of the peak c of the traveling-cap. The crown d of the said traveling-cap fits into the crown of the hat and when 30 placed in position forms the lining of the hat.

What I claim as my invention, and desire

to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A hat the brim of which is provided with a pocket having an opening, the said open-35 ing communicating with the interior of the hat, whereby a receptacle is formed for the brim of the cap worn inside of the hat, substantially as described.
