VERMIFUGE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 453,063, dated May 26, 1891.

Application filed December 30, 1889. Renewed February 24, 1891. Serial No. 382,536. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, James McCrossie, a subject of the Queen of Great Britain, and a resident of New Iberia, in the parish of Iberia and State of Louisiana, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Vermifuge; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

My medical compound is in the nature of an anthelmintic composition; and it consists of the following ingredients combined in about the proportions stated, viz: oil of chenopodium, one and one-half ounces; oil of peppermint, two drams; oil of turpentine, two drams; oil of anise, one dram; tincture of myrrh, one-half ounce; castor-oil, sufficient quantity to make when mixed with the other

ingredients one pint. These ingredients are thoroughly mixed by stirring and agitation, after which the compound is ready for use. It is administered in doses of from one half tea-spoonful to a table-spoonful, according to 25 age and as occasion requires.

I claim and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States—

The hereinbefore-described anthelmintic compound, consisting of the oils of chenopo- 30 dium, peppermint, turpentine, anise, castoroil, and tincture of myrrh, mixed in about the proportions set forth.
