

DOOR-SECURER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 496,887, dated May 9, 1893.

Application filed November 14, 1892. Serial No. 451, 998. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Beitknown that I, JEREMIAH H. MATTHEWS, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of South Bend, in the county of St. Joseph 5 and State of Indiana, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in a Combination Door-Securer and Corkscrew, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to that class of re-10 movable or portable door securers and cork screws, which can be conveniently carried in the vest pocket when not in use; and is always ready and handy to secure a door without the use of a key; or to pull a cork from a bot-

15 tle, &c.

This invention consists of my door securer, patented November 1, 1892, with an improved nut which is so formed, that a thimble like case fits over both ends of the same, thereby 20 forming a case for the door securer, as well as for the cork screw, which is so constructed that it fits directly over the bolt of the door securer when in the case, thereby allowing the case to be made small enough to be con-25 veniently carried in the vest pocket and which secures the pocket from being torn by the spurs of the door securer, or by the sharp point of the cork screw.

To this end, the invention consists of the 30 improvements which I will now proceed to de-

scribe and claim.

Of the accompanying drawings, forming a part of this specification, Figure 1 represents a perspective view of my case. Fig. 2 repre-35 sents a sectional view of the door securer, with the cork screws in their positions in the case when not in use. Fig. 3 shows the improved nut, which is part of the case, with parts broken away to show the inside forma-40 tion. Fig. 4 shows position of cork screw, with the bolt of the door securer as a handle when in position to extract a cork from a bottle, &c. Fig. 5 shows a perspective view of a door broken away with the door securer 45 and the improved nut in place.

A, in the drawings is the complete case.

a' is the improved nut with a projection or collar a^3 , as shown in Fig. 3.

 a^2 , is an orifice in nut a', into which the threaded bolt B, projects when screwed 50 through the nut a', and over which the cork screw fits when same is in the case.

If a door is to be locked or fastened by means of the device, all that is necessary is to take off the cap or thimble a^4 , insert the 55 bolt B, between door and jamb; projecting in that direction in which the door opens, and with the spur b', pointing toward the jamb which will be forced into the same by closing the door and which can then be securely fas- bo tened by simply turning the nut until it rests on the surface of the door and casing, and which can be secured as herein described, without interfering with the cork screw, or taking it out of the case.

If a cork is to be extracted, the bolt B, is inserted through the eye c', of the cork screw C, which forms a handle therefor, and by which a cork can easily be extracted from a bottle, &c.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A combined door securer, cork screw and case, consisting of the round nut a', having 75 the orifice a^2 , and the collar a^3 , the threaded bolt B, the cork screw C, with the eye c', said cork screw fitting into the orifice of the nut a², and over the bolt B, said bolt forming part of door securer and handle for cork screw, the 80 nut a', forming part of door securer and the case A, the thimbles a^4 , and a^5 , with the nut a', forming the case A, all substantially as shown and described.
