

PAPER-FASTENER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 506,674, dated October 17, 1893.

Application filed November 30, 1892. Serial No. 453,600. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Beit known that I, SIMON DANCYGER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Dayton, in the county of Montgomery and State of Ohio, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Paper-Fasteners; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the figures of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

My invention relates to improvements in paper fastenings, the features of which will be fully hereinafter described and claimed.

The object of my invention is the construction of a paper fastening of wire, which will be simple, effective and cheap, and is used the same as other devices for the purpose.

The construction is illustrated in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is top view of the device. Fig. 2 is a side view of the same.

The numerals designate like parts in the two views.

The wire fastener has a central bend 5, which brings the points central to the circu30 lar bends 4, 4, which form the head of the

fastener. The same comprises the central bend 5, the circular bends 4, 4, bends 6, 6 at a right angle to the former bends, and terminating in the abutting pointed shafts 7, 7.

In use an orifice is made through the paper, 35 the points entered and bent down on the under surface, in the usual manner, and the fastening is complete, the essential features being the curves forming the head and the bends snugly over the central part fixing the 40 abutting portions at a right angle to the plane of the head.

Having fully described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

As an improved article of manufacture the wire paper fastener having the wire bent with the central, curved portion, the circular bends forming the head and then bent snugly over said central portion at a right angle to said 50 head, and the ends bent down parallel and adjacent to each other forming the attaching prongs, substantially as set forth.
