


GAME APPARATUS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 526,946, dated October 2, 1894.

Application filed August 18, 1893. Serial No. 483,493. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FERDINAND ROBERT SCHLEININGER, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of New York, in the county and State of New York, have invented a certain new and useful Game Apparatus, of which the following is a specification.

My invention relates to game apparatus and has for its object the provision of a deto vice simple in construction, inexpensive in manufacture and efficient in practical use.

To attain the desired end my invention consists in the construction and arrangement of parts first fully set forth and then pointed 15 out in the claims.

In the drawings which form a part of this specification Figure 1 represents a plan view; and Figs. 2 and 3 are views in section on the lines x, x, and y, y Fig. 1.

Like letters of reference denote like parts in all the views.

Referring again to the drawings, A repreprovided with an open chamber B, and a 25 narrow way or groove C, provided with the adjacently lying series of stations D, furnished with designating means, as different colors, or, as in the present instance, figures.

A number of balls E, preferably in number 30 equal to the number of stations, and also provided with designating means corresponding with those of the stations D, are placed in the common chamber B, the groove C, being of such width as to admit therein the series of 35 balls E, only one at a time. I also duplicate the above parts in my box A, by providing the same with a similar chamber B', groove C', stations D and balls E although in manufacture obviously one set of parts may be 40 dispensed with if desired.

The open chambers B, B', are ordinarily concealed by an opaque covering F, and my box may also be provided with a glazed top F', and removable cover F2.

In operation the balls are assembled in the open chamber B, or the chambers B, and B', and the box A, is manipulated in order to cause the balls to enter the groove C, or the

ceed in having the greatest number of balls 50 in one groove to register with the adjacent stations, or with the balls in the other groove lying contiguous to the same.

As it is evident that many slight changes in the construction and relative arrangement 55 of parts might be resorted to without departing from the spirit and scope of my invention, I would have it understood that I do not restrict myself to the particular construction and arrangement of parts shown and de- 60 scribed but that I reserve the right to make such changes, and that

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. In a game, the combination with a num- 65 ber of balls provided with designating means, of a box provided with a common chamber wide enough to hold several balls abreast and large enough to loosely contain all the balls, of a straight channel or groove in alignment 70 with and communicating with the same, and sents a box, frame or equivalent receptacle | being long enough to contain all the balls and narrow enough to admit but one ball at a time, the said groove being also provided with designating means corresponding with 75 the balls.

2. In a game, the combination with a number of balls provided with designating means, of a box provided with a common chamber wide enough to hold several balls abreast and 80 large enough to loosely contain all the balls, the said chamber being provided with an opaque covering, of a straight channel or groove in alignment with and communicating with the same, and being long enough to con-85 tain all the balls and narrow enough to admit but one ball at a time, the said groove being also provided with designating means corresponding with the balls.

3. In a game apparatus the combination go with a number of balls provided with designating means, of a box provided with a common chamber wide enough to hold several balls abreast and large enough to loosely contain all the balls, of a channel or groove in 95 alignment with and communicating with the same and being long enough to contain all grooves C, and C', in such a manner as to suc- I the balls and narrow enough to admit but

one ball at a time, the said channel being also provided with designating means corresponding with the balls, and the said box being provided with a glazed top and a removable cover.
