

AUGUST KRESS, OF WEST BEND, WISCONSIN.

## PURSE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters-Patent No. 573,332, dated December 15, 1896.

Application filed December 23, 1895. Serial No. 573,038. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, August Kress, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of West Bend, in the county of Washington and State of Wisconsin, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Purses, &c.; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

My invention has for its object to simplify and cheapen the production of pocket-purses, ladies' hand-bags, and analogous goods, as well as to improve the finish of the same, said invention consisting in the peculiar formation of a purse or bag body whereby I do away with the end pieces commonly employed, as will be more specifically set forth with reference to the accompanying drawings and subsequently claimed.

In the drawings, Figure 1 represents a personance spective view of a purse-body made according to my invention as it appears stitched up and ready to be turned. Fig. 2 represents a plan view of a blank for the purse-body.

Referring by letter to the drawings, I show 25 the body of a pocket-purse made from a blank of leather or other suitable material. The blank may be of any desirable proportions in the matter of length and width, but it is essential that each longitudinal edge thereof be 30 provided with a single notch of predetermined depth and that the greatest depth of this notch touch an imaginary line exactly midway between the ends of said blank transversely of the same. Owing to the peculiar 35 notching of the material constituting the blank, the latter gradually increases in width in opposite directions from its longitudinal center. The blank having been cut, it is folded on itself wrong side out and the flaps united +

to each other by a seam b, of stitching, thus 40 forming the body of the pocket-purse, after which this body is turned to bring the seam inside the same.

The purse-body herein described is devoid of end pieces or inverted-V-shaped fullnesses 45 common to goods of the class herein set forth, nor has it a continuous bottom seam.

While the above description refers more particularly to pocket-purses, my invention is just as applicable to ladies' hand-bags and 50 analogous goods.

Having now fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

Abody for a purse or analogous article made 55 from a blank of leather or other suitable material of any desirable proportions in the matter of length and width but having each longitudinal edge thereof provided with a single notch the greatest depth of which touches an 60 imaginary line midway between the ends of said blank transversely of the latter, whereby the bottom seam is discontinuous, and the purse devoid of a V-shaped fullness, the blank being folded on itself wrong side out and hav- 65 ing its flaps united to each other by stitching, the product thus formed being subsequently turned to bring the seam inside thereof preliminary to finishing of the article of which it constitutes a part.
