

HEATING-SUPPORT FOR CURLING-IRONS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 591,205, dated October 5, 1897.

Application filed April 10, 1897. Serial No. 631,507. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Beitknown that I, Philip A. Bowen, a citizen of the United States, residing at Milwaukee, in the county of Milwaukee and State of Wisconsin, have invented new and useful Improvements in Heating-Supports for Curling-Irons, of which the following is a specification.

My invention relates to improvements in

heating-supports for curling-irons.

The object of my invention is to provide a device for holding the curling-iron in a position to be heated by the flame of a lamp without coating the iron with soot or interfering with the combustion.

In the following description reference is had to the accompanying drawing, in which is shown the upper portion of a lamp-chimney with my invention applied thereto.

The tubular holder is formed of a single piece of spirally-coiled wire A, provided with laterally extending loops B at each end, adapted to serve as handles, and a downwardly-extending portion C, adapted to engage the chimney-top.

The particular form in which the wire is 25 bent to form the chimney-engaging portion and the lateral handle extensions is not important, it being obvious that these parts may be formed in a variety of ways to suit the taste of the user.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Let-

ters Patent is—

A heating-support for curling-irons, comprising a tubular holder formed of a single 35 piece of spirally-coiled wire, adapted to receive the curling-iron, and having laterally-projecting loops adapted to serve as handles, and downward projections adapted to engage the top of a lamp-chimney, substantially for 40 the purpose set forth.
