


## TRAVELING-RUG

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 620,945, dated March 14, 1899.

Application filed August 15, 1898. Serial No. 688,581. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Louis Maurice, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, 5 have made certain new and useful Improvements in Rugs or Bags, of which the following is a specification.

My invention relates to improvements in that class of robes, rugs, or coverings which 10 are especially adapted for use by travelers in cold countries.

The object of my invention is to provide a covering of this character which can be easily put on and off by the user, which will thor-15 oughly protect the lower limbs, the lower part of the back, and the stomach of the wearer, and which can be adapted to a recumbent or a sitting posture with equal facility and comfort.

My invention is especially designed for use by drivers whose duties compel them to face cold driving winds.

In the accompanying drawings, which form a part of this application, Figure 1 represents 25 a front elevation of my invention, showing its position relative to the human form when in use. Fig. 2 is a perspective view, partly in section, showing the device closed.

In the drawings, 1 represents a cylindrical 30 bag closed at the bottom and open at the top and also provided with a central vertical slit or opening 1a in the front, which extends from the top of the bag to a point slightly below the center. From the bottom of this vertical 35 opening extends partly across the bag a horizontal cut or opening 1b. A flap 2 is formed by the vertical and horizontal openings, which is thrown open when the bag is being put on and serves as a closure when the bag is in | in presence of two witnesses. 40 use, suitable buttonholes being provided to engage the buttons on the front of the opposing portion 1c. In order that the portion 1c may be drawn close to the figure of the wearer and to relieve the strain on the buttons and

buttonholes, I provide straps 1d and buckles 45 2<sup>a</sup> on the parts 1<sup>c</sup> and 2, respectively.

An auxiliary triangular-shaped flap 3 is secured at the side of the main portion of the bag or may be formed therewith and is adapted to be folded across the front, so as to 50 cover the vertical and horizontal openings 1a and 1<sup>b</sup> and to form a double covering over the stomach and loins of the wearer, as shown in Fig. 2. The upper corner of the flap 3 is provided with a strap 3<sup>a</sup>, which passes part way 55 around the waist and is secured by a buckle 3b, which is attached to the outside of said flap at a point over the left hip of the wearer.

In order that the bag may be both warm and water-tight, I preferably make it with a wool 60 lining and a rubber or other waterproof-material exterior. In practice I have found that sheep-pelts with the wool side in and an oilskin covering secure the best results. The two materials may be sewed or otherwise per- 65 manently secured together throughout or they may be separable.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A bag of the character described having a lining of wool or the like, and a waterproof exterior, and provided with a vertical cut extending from the upper edge part way down the front, and a cut extending at right angles 75 from the lower end of the vertical cut, said cuts forming a flap at one side, a cover for said flap, said cover having an extension adapted to overlie the aforesaid cuts, and means for securing said extension at the side 80 of the bag, substantially as set forth.
