HERBAGE-EXTERMINATOR.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 638,951, dated December 12, 1899.

Application filed July 26, 1899. Serial No. 725, 158. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY F. BECKHAM, a citizen of the United States, residing at Olive Hill, in the county of Hardin and State of Tennessee, have invented a new and useful Herbage-Exterminator, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to herbage-exterminators; and it has for its object to provide a cheap and efficient compound for the extermination of weeds and other growths by direct application thereto.

The compound consists of hydrochloric acid, nitric acid, oil of sassafras, and sodium chlorid.

In the preparation of this compound a chemical combination is made by the intermixture of one pint of hydrochloric acid, one pint of nitric acid, two drops of oil of sassato fras, and four ounces of sodium chlorid.

In the application of this compound as an exterminator a sufficient quantity is applied near the roots of the plant to be affected, which quantity is preferably one ounce, although a more or less quantity may be applied, if desired.

Having thus described the invention, what is claimed is—

1. An exterminating compound consisting of hydrochloric acid, nitric acid, oil of sassa- 30 fras, and sodium chlorid.

2. An exterminating compound, consisting of the ingredients and proportions substantially as follows, hydrochloric acid one pint, nitric acid, one pint, oil of sassafras, two 35 drops, and sodium chlorid, four ounces.

3. An exterminating compound consisting of hydrochloric acid, nitric acid, and sodium chlorid.

4. An exterminating compound consisting 40 of the ingredients and proportions substantially as follows: hydrochloric acid, one pound; nitric acid, one pound, and sodium chlorid, four ounces.
