

## DEVICE FOR PACKING JARS, BOTTLES, &c.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 654,385, dated July 24, 1900.

Application filed May 18, 1900. Serial No. 17,133. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Otis H. Clough, of Redkey, in the county of Jay and State of Indiana, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Devices for Packing Jars, Bottles, &c., which is illustrated in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 shows in horizontal section a box containing a packing device constructed in accordance with my invention. Fig. 2 is a perspective view showing the packing device. Fig. 3 shows the sheet from which the plates and pieces are cut.

My improved packing device comprises plates or pieces 2 2, of cardboard or like material, which are preferably free at their ends and formed with longitudinal slots 3 3, and cross-pieces 4 4 are placed in these slots, extending at right angles to the pieces 2. The pieces 4 4, of the same width as the slots 3, may be constituted by the strips which are cut out from the pieces 2 in forming the said slots.

When the parts are assembled, as shown

in Fig. 2, they are placed in the box 5, which 25 they divide into compartments suitable for receiving the bottles or jars 6 6.

The device as a whole is cheap, and it affords a strong and satisfactory means for packing bottles, &c.

I claim—

1. A packing device comprising parallel plates 2, 2, free at their ends and having longitudinal slots, and cross-pieces fitting in the slots, and of the same width as the slots; sub- 35 stantially as described.

2. A packing device comprising plates 2, having longitudinal slots with cross-pieces fitting in said slots and constituted by strips removed from the plates 2 in forming the slots; 40 substantially as described.
