#### COMBINED STAMP AND COURT-PLASTER RECEPTACLE

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 656,254, dated August 21, 1900. Application filed February 16, 1900. Serial No. 5,448. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD KIBBE LA-THROP, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Springfield, county of Hampden, 5 and State of Massachusetts, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in a Combined Stamp and Court-Plaster Receptacle, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompany-10 ing drawings, forming a part thereof, in which similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

This invention relates to an improved combined stamp and court-plaster receptacle; 15 and the object thereof is to provide a compact article of this character which is adapted for being carried in the pocket without liability of injury to its contents. The de-, vice embodies two swinging compartments 20 or boxes arranged within a U-shaped shell | composed of a single piece of sheet metal, whereby a durable and inexpensive article is produced.

The invention will be hereinafter fully de-25 scribed, and specifically set forth in the an-

nexed claim.

In the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification, Figure 1 is a perspective view of my improved device, illus-30 trating the same in closed condition; and Fig. 2 is a plan view showing the boxes or

compartments thrown open.

In the practice of my invention I provide a rectangular casing or shell A, of U shape 35 in end elevation and embodying oppositelylocated side walls a and a bottom wall a', all being formed from a single piece of sheet metal, preferably aluminium; but I do not confine myself to the use of any specific ma-40 terial, as it is obvious that the article could be made of celluloid, hard rubber, or any other suitable material. Located within this shell are two boxes or compartments B, which are respectively secured to the shell by means 45 of pins or pivots b, which pass through the said boxes and also through the walls a of the shell A, to which they are securely rivet-

ed, welded, or otherwise fastened at their ends, whereby said boxes are securely fastened to the shell A, but allowed freely to 50 swing therein..

Each box B is provided with a projected thumb-piece b', to be used for swinging or operating them, and these said thumb-pieces are preferably stamped and formed integrally 55

The boxes B are each supplied with a finger-opening  $b^2$  through the bottom thereof to permit pushing of the contents upwardly to remove said contents when the box is opened. 60

In use the boxes are filled one with a plurality of sheets of court-plaster and the other with a number of postage-stamps, and it is obvious that while the compartments are closed within the shell the contents are se- 65 curely protected against injury and that the device can be conveniently carried in the pocket and the contents can be readily removed as desired.

I do not confine myself to the specific use 70 of the device as a means for carrying courtplaster and postage-stamps, as it may also. be used for car-tickets or other similar articles; neither do I confine myself to the exact proportions as shown in the drawings.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Let-

ters Patent, is—

with the boxes.

A receptacle for stamps and court-plaster and like materials, comprising a case A, con- 80 structed as specified, and two boxes B, B, pivoted in said case at b and b, and arranged to turn separately, in and out of said case, and formed with thumb-pieces b' and b', and hinged lids, and finger-openings  $b^2$  and  $b^2$ , all 85 substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
