

BATH OR RUBBING GLOVE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 674,913, dated May 28, 1901.

Application filed February 9, 1901. Serial No. 46,628. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. FIKE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Iberia, in the county of Miller and State of Missouri, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Bath or Rubbing Gloves; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

The present invention has for its object to provide a bath or rubbing glove having a pocket in the palm thereof for containing suitable medicated material or rubbing compound; and it consists of a glove constructed substantially as shown in the drawings and hereinafter described and claimed.

Figure 1 of the drawings is a plan view of the glove; Fig. 2, a similar view with the protecting-covering removed to show the position of the pocket with relation to the palm of the glove; Fig. 3, a longitudinal section of Fig. 1.

In the accompanying drawings, A represents the glove, of yarn or any other suitable material found most desirable and of any preferred size and shape, said glove having a pocket B in the palm thereof, which may be formed thereon or made separate and afterward secured by stitching or otherwise, as preferred, in manufacturing the same. This pocket, as will be noticed, is of a width substantially equal to the width of the glove, so that it will nearly cover the entire palm to contain the medicated material or any sub-

stance that may be found desirable to use in washing, rubbing, or otherwise treating the person on whom the glove is used.

A protecting-covering C is temporarily secured to the palm of the glove over the pocket to retain the medicated or other compound therein, said covering being of any preferred material and stitched or otherwise secured to the glove.

A glove constructed as herein described may be used for general bathing purposes by placing in the pocket a soap compound and the glove placed upon the hand, dipped in water, and then applied to the body or other 50 parts in the manner of a wash-rag or flesh-brush, or any suitable medicated material having detersive and hygienic properties may be placed in the pocket and the glove used in any manner found most preferable.

Having now fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A bath or rubbing glove having a pocket extending lengthwise thereof and connected 60 to the palm, and a protecting-covering secured to the glove over said pocket to retain the material therein, substantially as and for the purpose specified.
