

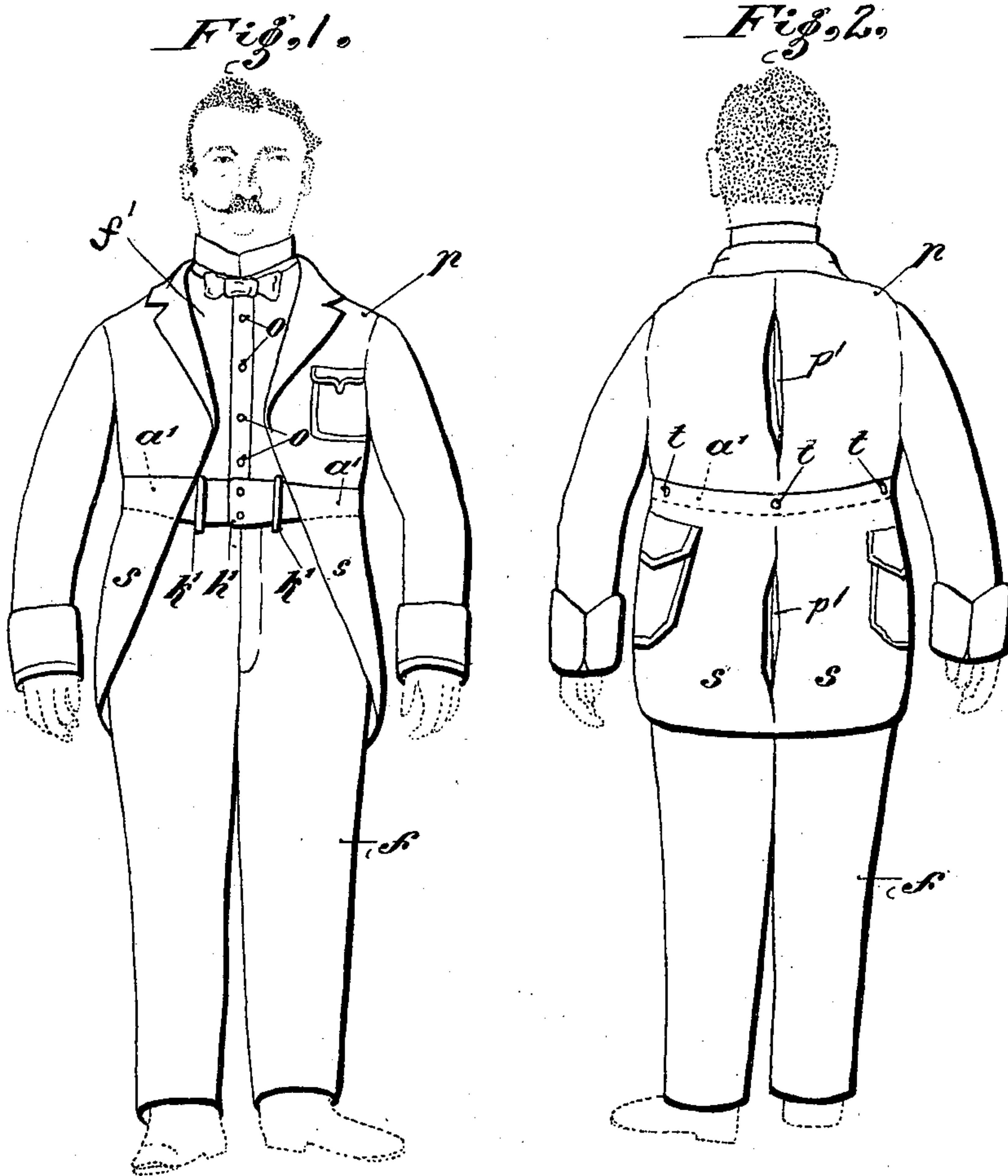

COMBINATION-GARMENT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 700,601, dated May 20, 1902.

Application filed December 18, 1900. Serial No. 40,284. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORG BALDSZUN, manufacturer, a subject of the Grand Duke of Saxe-Weimar, residing at Weimar, in the
5 Grand Duchy of Saxe-Weimar and Empire of Germany, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Combination-Garments, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to a combination-garment suitable for cyclists, riders, and sports-
10 men of all classes; and it consists of a shirt and trousers, the shirt having a false front to simulate a coat or jacket, a tailpiece connected to the back of the garment made to represent the tail of a coat or jacket, and a belt to
15 surround the garment substantially at the waist.

The invention is clearly illustrated in the accompanying drawings, forming a part of
20 this specification, and in which—

Figure 1 is a front view of a combination-garment including my invention; and Fig. 2 is a back view of the same, both showing the manner of using the article.

25 Like characters refer to like parts in both figures of the drawings.

The trousers *f* and shirt *f'* are suitably connected together and are of any desirable form or shape, the shirt having a central opening
30 at its front adapted to be held closed by buttons *o*. The shirt *f'* is provided with a false front *p*, made to represent a coat or jacket and suitably fastened thereto. The tail of the garment is denoted by *s*, and it is connect-

ed to the back of the garment, for example, 35 by means of buttons *t*, so that said tail or flap can be easily removed or applied. A belt *a'* is adapted to surround the garment at or near the waist, and its forward ends *h'* are adapted to overlap and to be fastened by but- 40 tons or the like, such forward ends of the belt extending through loops *k'*, suitably fastened to the garment. The back of the garment may have in the body of the shirt *f'* and in the tail *s* plaits *p'* to allow the garment to ex- 45 pand at such point.

Having described the invention, I claim—

1. A combination-garment consisting of a shirt and trousers, the shirt having a false front to simulate a coat or jacket, a tailpiece 50 connected to the back of the garment made to represent the tail of a coat or jacket, and a belt to surround the garment, substantially at the waist.

2. A combination-garment consisting of a 55 shirt and trousers, the shirt having a false front to simulate a coat or jacket, and a tail-piece detachably connected to the back of the garment and made to represent the tail of a coat or jacket. 60
