

WILLIE WASHINGTON HOLLAND, OF BREMOND, TEXAS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 706,056, dated August 5, 1902.

Application filed April 18, 1902. Serial No. 103,570. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIE WASHINGTON Holland, a citizen of the United States, residing at Bremond, in the county of Robert-5 son and State of Texas, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Bottles, of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying

drawings.

My invention relates to that class of bottles known as "non-refillable" bottles; and my object is to produce a bottle of this type of as few parts as possible, of especially economical construction, and one which can be 15 readily filled and emptied in a simple manner. It is also my object to provide a bottle of this type having instead of a stopper a closed neck with a vulnerable portion which is readily accessible and can be easily muti-20 lated to discharge the liquid and yet be shielded from accidental breakage and to so arrange said portion that the broken glass therefrom will be discharged and conducted outside of the bottle by a channel having an 25 outlet separate from the bottle's mouth.

In the accompanying drawings, forming a part of this specification, Figure 1 is a vertical section of my non-refillable bottle, and Fig. 2 is a detail perspective view of the neck.

30 Referring more particularly to the drawings, A denotes the body of the bottle, which may be of any desired shape, provided with an opening a in its bottom portion through which it is filled. The opening a is closed by 35 a glass stopper which is glued or cemented in said opening or by annealing the opening.

B denotes the neck of the bottle, terminating at its upper end in a solid portion b, which

is formed integral with the neck.

40 b'b' denote two knobs formed integral with the neck at one side and project horizontally therefrom for the purposes hereinafter mentioned. I have shown two knobs, but any number may be used.

C denotes a false neck made integral with the neck proper and forms with the upper

portion of the neck proper the mouth of the bottle.

c denotes an opening at the bottom of the false neck arranged at a point below the 50 knobs b'b' for the purpose hereinafter named. The false neck acts as a shield to prevent ac-

cidental breakage of said knobs.

To open the bottle, any hard substance, such as a pocket-knife or other convenient im- 55 plement, is passed down through the mouth of the bottle into the false neck and pressed or struck against the knobs $b^\prime \ b^\prime$ until they break off, thus forming one or more openings in the side of the neck. As said knobs pro- 60 ject horizontally into the false neck when severed from the neck proper, they fall into the false neck and are carried by gravity through the opening c clear of the bottle. Thus all danger of broken glass passing in- 65 side the bottle is avoided, as well as the danger of passing it through the mouth of the bottle into the receiving vessel.

Having thus shown and described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by 70

Letters Patent, is—

1. A bottle having a closed neck formed integral with the bottle, a vulnerable portion to said neck, a shield for said vulnerable portion formed integral with the neck and serv- 75 ing also as the mouth of the bottle, and means for filling and sealing the bottle.

2. A bottle having a closed neck formed integral with the bottle, a vulnerable portion to said neck accessible through the mouth of 80 the bottle, a false neck or shield for said vulnerable portion forming the mouth of the bottle and also a passage-way to conduct the broken glass from the bottle-mouth, and means for filling and sealing the bottle.
