

TOBACCO-PIPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 754,338, dated March 8, 1904.

Application filed May 16, 1903. Serial No. 157,339. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Josef Pareis, a subject of the Emperor of Austria-Hungary, residing at 5 Wollzeile I, Vienna, Austria-Hungary, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Tobacco-Pipes, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to tobacco-pipes or equivalent devices in which the water is prevented from entering into the dissectible pipe-bowl and the smoke becomes cleaned before passing through the water-chamber and pipe-stem and entering into the mouth of the smoker.

The annexed drawing shows such a tobacco-

pipe in longitudinal section.

The pipe-bowl consists of a tobacco-box 2, detachably secured in the case 1 of the bowl. Between this case and the box is provided a chamber 3. The lower end of the case forms a plug 4 and is closed with a bottom 5. On the inside of the case 1 are arranged small pipes 6, which pass through the bottom 5 and enter the water-chamber 7 and are curved upward at their projecting ends.

The tobacco-box 2 reaches near the bottom 5 and is provided on its lower end with a hole 8, so that a chamber 9 is left. The upper edge of the box forms a flange which lies on the flange of the case. The cover 10 is attached to the box 2 preferably by means of a hinge 11. The smoke passes through the hole 8 in the direction of arrow, enters the cham-

ber 9, which chamber may be filled with a smoke-filter, there depositing impurities and 35 noxious products. Then it rises through chamber 3 between the case 1 and box 2 and passes out through the said pipes 6 and enters the water-chamber and flows through the pipestem in the mouthpiece and to the mouth of 40 the smoker. The upward curved part of the pipes 6 prevents the water from passing from the water-chamber into the bowl in all positions of the bowl.

What I claim as my invention is—

In a tobacco-pipe or an equivalent device, the combination of a bowl-case, a water-chamber with which said bowl-case engages, a tobacco-box provided with a flanged top and adapted to be inserted in said bowl-case and leave a 50 chamber between the same and said bowl-case, a smoke-outlet in the bottom of said tobacco-box, a bottom closure for said bowl-case, small pipes passing through said bottom and extending up into the chamber between the to-55 bacco-box and the bowl-case, and having upwardly-curved ends projecting below said bottom and into said water-chamber, substantially as described.
