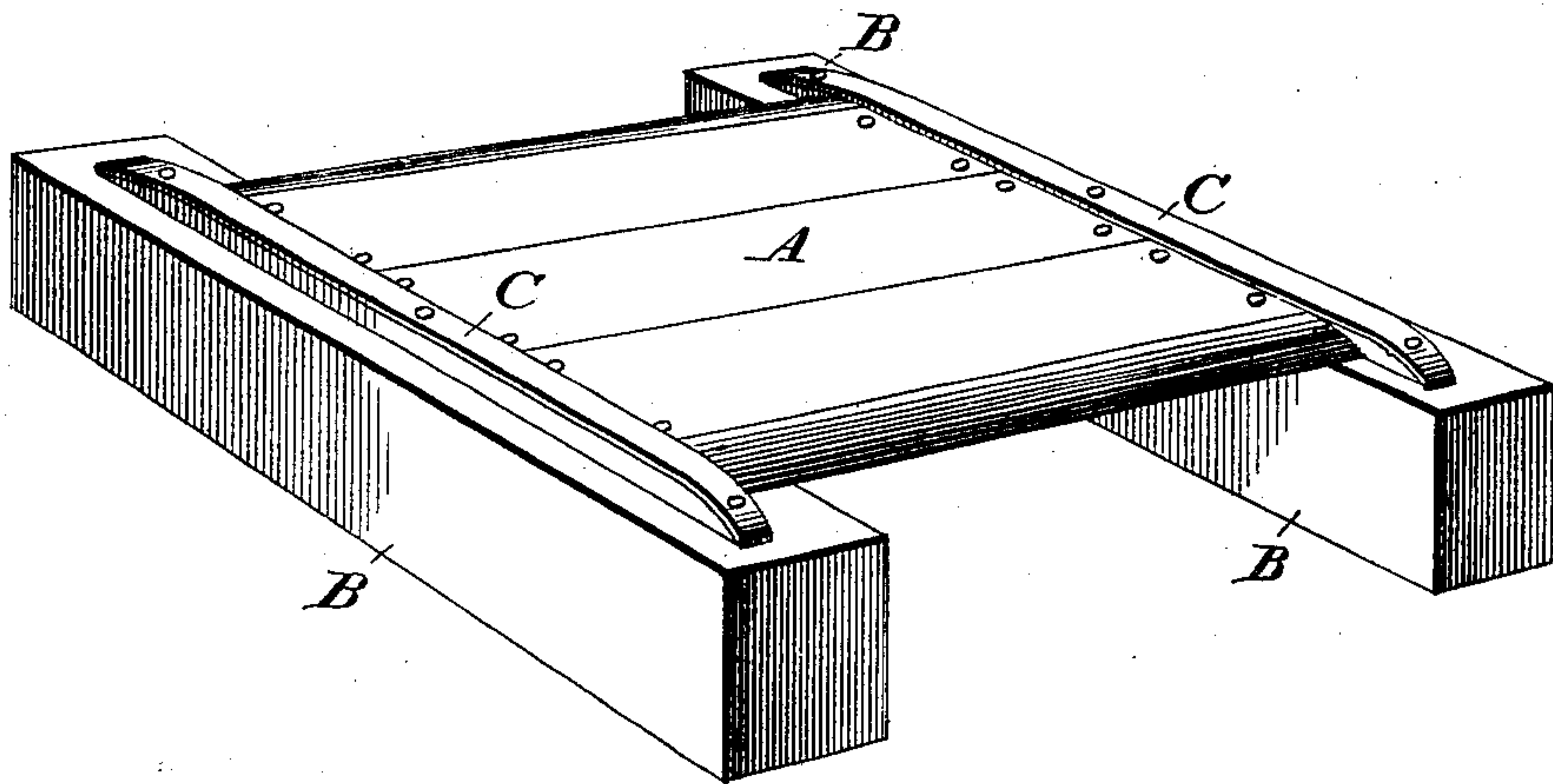

## SIDEWALK ON STREET-CROSSINGS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 754,895, dated March 15, 1904.

Application filed April 3, 1903. Serial No. 151,005. (No model.)

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JAMES ALLEN ROSE, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at Prairie City, in the county of McDonough, in the State of Illinois, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Sidewalks on Street-Crossings and Bridges, reference being had therein to the accompanying drawing.

10 The object of this invention is to protect a sidewalk - crossing when threshing - machine traction-engines are riding over it.

In describing the invention in detail reference is had to the accompanying drawing, 15 forming a part of this specification.

B B represent the sills, laid five feet two inches apart and embedded in the street with the rails C C, which are covered with iron for the protection of said rails and are made se-

cure lengthwise upon said sills by means of 20 nails.

A represents the section of the sidewalk which connects the said sills by means of nails, thus making one section of sidewalk complete.

Having fully described my invention, what 25 I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

In a street-crossing, the combination of a section comprising transverse sills spaced apart and embedded in the street-rails secured 30 longitudinally upon said sills and means to secure said rails together as and for the purposes herein specified.
