

COMBINED SHIRT AND CRAVAT.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 780,237, dated January 17, 1905.

Application filed April 5, 1904. Serial No. 201,663.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, George W. Sheckells, of the city of Baltimore and State of Maryland, have invented certain Improvements in a Combined Shirt and Cravat, of which the following is a specification.

Figure 1 is an exterior front view of the upper part of what is generally known as a "negligée shirt" provided with a cravat after the manner of the present invention and showing the cravat before it is tied. Fig. 2 is a view similar to Fig. 1, except that the cravat is shown as tied.

Referring now to the drawings, 1 is the bosom, 2 the neckband, and 3 the collar.

The cravat consists of two strips 5 and 7 of suitable material, the one, 5, being sewed to the upper edge of the overlapped portion of the bosom 1 centrally of the opening 6 be
veen the end of the collar and extending, when straightened, in a vertical direction, as shown in Fig. 1. The strip 7 is sewed horizontally to the overlapped portion of the neckband 2, as shown in Fig. 1. The strip 5 is provided with a buttonhole 9 near its end or in such position that when the said strip is turned down in the tying operation, hereinafter described, it will register with the button 10, as shown in Fig. 2 in dotted line.

The overlapped portion of the bosom near 30 to and under the upper button 12 is provided with a slot 13 of such size as will admit of the strip 5 being easily passed through it in the tying operation.

The cravat is tied after the neckband is 35 buttoned, and to effect the appearance of a bow the strip 7 is folded twice upon itself and while it is held in a folded condition the strip 5 is brought down tightly over it and passed through the slot 13 and buttoned.

I claim as my invention—

In a shirt, the open bosom thereof provided with a slot near its upper end, combined with a cravat formed of two separate strips, one of the said strips being sewed vertically to the overlapped portion of the bosom, and adapted to be turned down and inserted through the slot in the bosom, and the other fastened horizontally to the overlapped part of the neckband, and adapted to be folded 50 twice upon itself, and crossed by the vertical strip before the same is inserted in the said slot, substantially as, and for the purpose specified.
