COMPOUND FOR CLEANING BOILERS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 792,462, dated June 13, 1905.

Application filed January 10, 1905. Serial No. 240,505.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CIPRIANO SALAZAR, residing at Albuquerque, Bernalillo county, and ENRIQUE H. SALAZAR, residing at Las Vegas, San Miguel county, Territory of New Mexico, citizens of the United States, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Compounds for Cleaning Boilers, Boiler-Tubes, &c.; and we do declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

This invention relates to a new and useful compound to be used for cleaning boilers, boiler-tubes, &c.

The compound consists of the following ingredients combined in the proportions stated, viz: water, one gallon; *Gobernadora*, twelve ounces; *Covillea tridentata*, four ounces. These plants are well known in New Mexico, where they grow abundantly. The plant *Gobernadora* is also known as "*Hediondia*." These ingredients should be allowed to boil together four hours, when the preparation is removed from the fire and allowed to cool, after which it is strained and placed in barrels, bottles, or other receptacles for use.

The above-named composition is intended to be used principally for cleaning boilers, boiler-tubes, &c., and by the use of the same said boilers or tubes may be quickly and easily cleaned.

Having thus described our process, what we claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

1. The herein-described vegetable composition consisting of water, *Gobernadora*, and *Covillea tridentata*; substantially as and for the purposes described.

2. The herein-described vegetable composition for cleaning boilers, boiler-tubes &c., mixed in the proportions of one gallon of water, twelve ounces of *Gobernadora*, and four ounces of *Covillea tridentata*, boiled together and strained, substantially as described.
